

Recommendations for Philanthropy's Engagement with the Federal Administration

A new federal administration presents new opportunities to work towards racial and housing justice to end homelessness and housing instability. As philanthropy looks to engage with the Biden-Harris administration, Funders Together has developed **recommendations to ensure the first year sets a strong foundation for creating and implementing bold policies rooted in housing justice**.

Funders must focus on ensuring that people with lived expertise help to build racially just housing infrastructure and that there are strong accountability measures to maintain it. We believe philanthropy has an obligation to support and resources efforts that will disrupt the status quo that centers whiteness and upholds white supremacy. All these recommendations for engaging with the new administration begin with and prioritize racial and housing justice.
