Charter One sending 2,000 Southeast Michigan children back to school with new backpacks filled with school supplies

Initiative has helped more than 253,000 children across the bank's footprint since 2003

Southfield, Mich. – Charter One is helping 2,000 students start the school year with new backpacks filled with school supplies through its Gear for Grades program as part of the Hunger Free Summer program. Nearly a ton of pencils, pens, folders, notebooks, glue sticks and index cards were donated by the public in all branches across Michigan. Gear for Grades was organized in partnership with Gleaners Community Food Bank of Southeastern Michigan.

According to a National Retail Federation survey, the average American family spent \$603 in 2012 on back-to-school expenses. For low-income, at-risk or homeless families, the cost of even basic school supplies can be a burden.

"With the rising cost of school supplies, the Gear for Grades program helps to ease the financial strain parents face this time of year as they prepare to send their children back to school," said Ken Marblestone, President of Charter One, Michigan and Ohio. "We are proud to play a role in contributing to the academic success of local children who will now return to the classroom ready to learn. We thank our customers and the general public who supported this program by donating new school supplies which make a big difference to the children who receive them. I also want to thank Gleaners Community Food Bank of Southeastern Michigan for their critical role in this year's program."

The Gear for Grades program is a part of Citizens Helping Citizens Strengthen Communities, the bank's program for contributing to the economic vitality of communities. Charter One colleagues and community members volunteered to help fill the supplies in logo-free backpacks donated by the Charter One Foundation to help ensure children have a positive experience as they return to the classroom.
