Introduction



With the generous support of funders and community members, Hawai'i Children's Action Network (HCAN) successfully completed our 7th annual Hawai'i Parent Leadership Leadership Institute (PLTI) and has now trained over 100 alumni.

We honor 2022–2023 PLTI graduates, participants, facilitators, mentors, site coordinators, and their families for sacrificing time and energy to invest in our collective power!

PLTI's goal is to develop a culture of family civic engagement and leadership across Hawai'i, where parents and community leaders work side-by-side with policymakers to improve child and family outcomes.

HCAN reached out to stakeholders across the state to identify and recruit parents and community leaders who have the potential and interest to become advocates for children and families in their communities. We conducted outreach via social media, email, newsletters, and through our deep connections with local nonprofits and public agencies. We created digital flyers, and graphics for social media posts, and purchased Facebook ads to increase visibility.


Cohorts

For our 2022-2023 PLTI, we had 103 applicants. Of the pool of applicants, 65 were selected to interview. Of the 65 interviewees, 60 were accepted into the program. Our 2022-2023 PLTI concluded with 20 parent leaders who successfully completed the program and graduated.



PLTI offered a mixed format with two virtual cohorts (Oʻahu and statewide) and one hybrid cohort on Maui. The two virtual cohorts ran from September 2022 through February 2023. The Maui hybrid cohort ran from January through May 2023. Each cohort began with a retreat, completed 20 weekly sessions, and culminated with a graduation celebration.

Although a choice of in-person sessions was offered on O'ahu, the vast majority applicants preferred the cohorts this year. Only 2 people applied for the in-person cohort on O'ahu, and 54 for virtual, thus we decided to do 2 virtual cohorts. Participants also seemed to enjoy the hybrid option offered on Maui, where it is more geographically spreadout. This allows for some in-person interactions and networking, and some virtual sessions. Parent leaders expressed enjoying this hybrid version.



Final Thoughts...

Surprisingly, the remote sessions did not adversely ability affect the participants to develop deep personal connections as inreported by previous cohorts. The person two virtual cohorts were able to network and bond as reflected in the participant evaluations (and the heartfelt sharing at the cohort graduations).

The primary challenge was attrition, as we started with a total of 60 parent leaders who were accepted into the program. As many are virtual participants, it is challenging for parents to juggle being at home and having to take care of daily tasks, while trying to participate, which may be one reason for the attrition rates.
