Regional Factsheet



Dufferin County boasts prime farmland classified by a unique honeywood loam soil that supports the growth of many kinds of produce. Farmers can grow up to 20 tons of food per acre on this land.

Durham Region includes Greenbelt urban river valleys, such as Oshawa Creek, Carruthers Creek and the Bowmanville Creek.

- Almost 254,000 acres of Durham are in agricultural production by over 1,200 farms^{iv}, a majority of which are in the Greenbelt

Halton Region includes significant Greenbelt features, such as the Niagara Escarpment, Sixteen Mile Creek, Fourteen Mile Creek and Bronte Creek.

- The Greenbelt sustains almost 16,000 jobsⁱ in Halton Regionⁱⁱ
- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activity^{|||}: \$58 million^{||}
- \$120 million contribution to regional GDP (2016)ⁱⁱ
- \$1.6 billion in gross output from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbelt
- 431 active farms in Halton Region in 2021^{iv}, a majority of which are in the Greenbelt
- Over \$161 million in gross farm receipts in 2021^{iv}

Hamilton includes many Greenbelt features, such as the Niagara Escarpment, Grindstone Creek and Fifty Creek.

- The Greenbelt sustains almost 26,000 jobsⁱ in Hamiltonⁱⁱ
- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activity : \$101 million
- \$2.6 billion in gross output from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbelt
- \$1.15 billion contribution to Hamilton GDP (2016)
- 679 active farms on 118,070 acres in Hamilton in 2021^{iv}
- Over \$366 million in gross farm receipts in 2021^{iv}

Niagara Region includes significant features of the Greenbelt, such as the Niagara Escarpment and Twelve Mile Creek.

- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activityⁱⁱⁱ: \$57 millionⁱⁱ
- \$1.9 billion in gross output from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbelt
- \$889 million contribution to Regional GDP (2016)

- 1,651 active farms in Niagara Region in 2021^{iv}, a majority of which are in the Greenbelt
- \$1 billion in gross farm receipts in 2021^{iv}
- The Greenbelt sustains approximately 19,000 jobsi in Niagara Region

Northumberland includes sections of the Oak Ridges Moraine, and a quarter of the Greenbelt cycling trail winds through the County.

- The Greenbelt sustains approximately 956 jobsi in Northumberland Countyii
- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activityⁱⁱⁱ (2016): \$3.3 millionⁱⁱ
- \$46 million contributionⁱ to County GDP (2016)ⁱⁱ
- \$104 million in gross output from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbelt
- 840 active farms in Northumberland County in 2021^{iv}
- \$188 million in gross farm receipts in 2021^{iv}

Peel Region includes significant features of the Greenbelt, such as the Niagara Escarpment, Oak Ridges Moraine, the Credit River and Etobicoke Creek.

- The Greenbelt sustains approximately 3,235 jobs in Peel Regionⁱⁱ
- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activityⁱⁱⁱ (2016): \$12.6 millionⁱⁱ
- \$348 million in gross output from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbelt
- \$157 million contribution to Regional GDP (2016)

Wellington County includes significant Greenbelt features, such as the headwaters of watersheds that drain to Lake Ontario: Credit River watershed in Erin, and Bronte and Spencer Creek watersheds in Puslinch.

- The Greenbelt sustains over 1,250 jobsⁱ in Wellington Countyⁱⁱ
- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activityⁱⁱⁱ: \$3.2 millionⁱⁱ
- \$147 million in gross outputⁱ from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbeltⁱⁱ
- \$69 million contributionⁱ to County GDP (2016)ⁱⁱ

York Region includes significant features of the Greenbelt, such as the Oak Ridges Moraine, Don River and Rouge River.

- The Greenbelt sustains approximately 44,521 jobsⁱ in York Regionⁱⁱ
- Municipal tax revenue from Greenbelt economic activity \$120 million
- \$4.4 billion in gross outputⁱ from agriculture, forestry, fishing, tourism and hospitality in the Greenbelt (2016) ii
- \$2 billion contributionⁱ to Regional GDP (2016)ⁱⁱ
- 604 active farms in York Region in 2021^{iv}, a majority of which are in the Greenbelt
- Over \$390 million in gross farm receipts in 2021^{iv}
