Connected Actions, Sustainable Neighbourhoods: Hotwells, Cliftonwood and Harbourside Community Climate Action Plan Launch

We are delighted that we will be launching our Community Climate Action Plan at our AGM (9 July). The plan has been drawn together from conversations, workshops and surveys with over 200 residents of all ages. It sets out the priorities of our communities on climate change: how we develop our local resilience and solutions for these global challenges. Organised under different thematic headings, local people identified a "wishlist" of priorities including: better routes for pedestrians, cyclists, promotion of food equity, cleaning up the waterways, a Repair Cafe in Hotwells, supporting historic infrastructure to be more green, more green jobs, especially for young people, valuing and preserving our existing wildlife habitats. These are just a few of the priorities identified and we are working out how our communities and the community association starts to turn these priorities and calls to action into reality.

We would also like to express our gratitude to Anna Haydock-Wilson who has pulled all this thinking together into the Plan.

For a long period of time, Anna Haydock Wilson has spearheaded the maintenance and development of this space with our communities. Anna is now stepping back from this role and we urgently need to decide how best HCCA and our communities continue to look after the Piazza for the benefit of all. This situation is even more critical due to the Western Harbour Masterplan which, as it stands, will see the Cumberland Piazza disappear in its current form. HCCA is a small volunteer run organisation and our current committee has limited capacity to continue supporting the Piazza and faces giving back control to Bristol City Council. The redevelopment of Western Harbour presents a significant opportunity for Bristol to enhance its waterfront, restore its historical character, and create a thriving and well-integrated community. Despite initial hopes that the proposal would reflect the input of local residents and take a sensitive approach to development, it instead prioritizes high-density housing blocks that fail to respect the area's heritage or address pressing infrastructure challenges. Brunel's Other Bridge Volunteers' Workday 17 May 9.30am

We plan to investigate more of the century-old hydraulic machinery in under-ground pits at the west end of the Knuckle, aka 'The Tongue'. We'll also be continuing our routine gardening (especially vanquishing weeds under the Bridge) and over-painting graffiti.

The Swivel Bridge is just off Brunel Lock Road BS1 6XS. Cross the lock on a narrow bridge immediately to the west of the Plimsoll Bridge. There is some free-parking by the Bridge and lots more space on Brunel Lock Road for a modest charge. If you prefer to travel by Metro Bus we are five minutes walk from Cumberland Basin stop on Line M2.

We'll get you signed in, give a brief induction, and fit you out with basic safety gear such as a hi-viz vest, gloves, and a hard hat if needed. Join us for a relaxed lunch-break with your own picnic and folding chair. Newcomers are always welcome, you'll find us a friendly bunch. Children are welcome provided they are always supervised by an adult one-to-one.

You should wear stout shoes and oldish clothes, and please bring your own safety gear if you have it. If you would like to help with the 'gardening' please bring your own tools.

Remember BOB is in a Clean Air Zone. If coming by car check whether it complies with the requirements for free access on <u>https://www.gov.uk/clean-air-zones</u> (70% of cars are free)

West Bristol Climate Action

A quick update

Due to capacity issues, we're scaling back our work a little—but we're not disappearing! Instead, we're refocusing under this title of "**West Bristol Biodiversity Action**", with a slightly narrower lens on protecting and enhancing local biodiversity. This means the formal structure of West Bristol Climate Action (including its regular AGMs, maintaining its website and monitoring of the WBCA email) will cease.

Here's what's happening:

• We'll continue managing the existing wildflower meadows at Clifton Hill Meadow and Clifton Zoo Bank. These sites are thriving, and we're committed to maintaining them (and topping them up when needed).

- Unfortunately, two other sites we tried to establish—Clifton Downs Ladies Mile (due to compacted soil) and Cumberland Basin (waterlogged from high tides)—haven't worked out. Sometimes nature has other plans!
- We will still have a budget held with Grow Wilder (Avon Wildlife Trust) to care for the existing meadows and—if the right opportunity arises—potentially expand to new sites if capacity allows.
