Lynette Russell Prize for First Peoples' History in Schools - Entry form

The Lynette Russell Prize for First Peoples' History in Schools was established in 2021 to recognise the efforts of Victorian school students in years 7-10 in their study of First Peoples' history. The prize was established by Professor Lynette Russell AM to encourage the creative engagement and deeper knowledge of a wider number of secondary school students in this area of fundamental importance to historical literacy and an educated citizenry.

The prize will consist of a cash payment of \$500 and a certificate presented to the school. The use of the prize will be determined by the teacher or Koori Education Support Officer, as appropriate, in consultation with students. Winners will also be recognised with acknowledgement via the HCV's publications and social media, and year-long membership to the HCV Friends.
