## Session Tracks - Operational Definitions

**Clinical –** presentations reflect content that drives learning and improvement in clinical processes & outcomes, emerging trends in delivering care, and content is focused for clinicians involved in care delivery.

**Engagement –** presentations reflect content on engaging patients and parent/caregivers in care delivery, understanding the experience of IBD treatment, and strengthening partnerships with clinicians.

**Equity –** presentations reflect content on closing health equity gaps, making care and treatment accessible to all patients, and developing processes to improve outcomes based on social drivers of health.

**Nutrition –** presentations focus on nutrition and dietary options to treat IBD, emerging evidence, and partnership with dietitians.

**Psychosocial –** presentations reflect content that incorporates a variety of perspectives focused on mental health, includes diverse perspectives with content contribution from psychologists and social workers.

**Quality Improvement –** presentations demonstrate application of QI methodology to demonstrate learnings and improvement in processes & outcomes to drive reliability.

**Data/Technology –** presentations leverage electronic health records, *Outcomes* Registry, apps, artificial intelligence, etc. as methods to gather and analyze data to improve processes & outcomes.
