Victim Restitution

- Creates a victim restitution fund.
- The fund receives money when criminal fines are paid.
- Fiscal Impact- General Fund revenue is estimated to decrease by approximately \$2.1 million. Emergency Medical Services Fund revenue is estimated to decrease by approximately \$27,000. • The total revenue to counties is estimated to decrease by approximately \$347,000. • The estimated revenue to the Victim Restitution Fund is approximately \$2.4 million.

Section by Section Analysis

Section 1 Judicial Branch-Collection of Fees in Criminal Cases and Disposition of Fees and Fines Under current law, when a fine for a criminal violation is paid the money is distributed as follows: 91% to state court administrator 9% to county treasurer for deposit in county general fund

The bill changes the fine distribution: 85% to the state court administrator 8% to county treasurer for deposit in county general fund 7% to the victim restitution fund established in section 2

Section 2- Victim Restitution Fund

Establishes a victim restitution fund. Money will be used for pecuniary damages, and restitution for the death of a victim.

Pecuniary damages are those not paid by an insurer or insurance claim by a victim.
