## **Time of Transfer Inspection Fraud & Penalties**

House File 634 makes changes to the 'Time-of-Transfer' inspections certification and administrative process specifications and imposes a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 and inspector's certification license suspension of 1-year for fraudulent filing of a time-of-transfer report with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

- Only certified inspectors may conduct a time-of-transfer inspections.
- Inspector's certification is considered current if the inspector if it meets certain Code specified requirements.
- DNR is to maintain a publicly available list of currently certified inspectors on the DNR internet site with the list displaying when an inspector first was certified and when their certification is set to expire.
- A certified inspector who fraudulent files a time-of-transfer report with DNR is subject to a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 and suspension of inspector's certification for one year.
- Sellers of property subject to time-of-transfer inspection is responsible for a complete report as part of a real estate transaction.

## **Section by Section Analysis of Amendment**

Section 1—Time-of-Transfer Inspector Certification, Fraud, & Penalties

Amends Section 455B.172, subsection 11, paragraph e, Code 2023 add a number of additional provisions and subdivides this paragraph. The new provisions clarify and provides that—

- Only certified inspectors may conduct a time-of-transfer inspections.
- Inspector's certification is considered current if the inspector if it meets certain Code specified requirements:
  - o Inspector has paid initial and renewal fees required to maintain certification
  - Is up-to-date on continuing education units,
  - Is in good standing with DNR, and has not been decertified.
- DNR is to maintain a publicly available list of currently certified inspectors on the DNR internet site with the list displaying when an inspector first was certified and when their certification is set to expire.
- A certified inspector who fraudulent files a time-of-transfer report with DNR is subject to a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 and suspension of inspector's certification for one year.
- Sellers of property subject to time-of-transfer inspection is responsible for a complete report as part of a real estate transaction.
