### Out-of-State Teacher Licensure

- Allows a student who has completed a practitioner prep program in another state to apply and receive licensure in Iowa. Removes the requirement that there is a license issued from the other state.
- For an out of country applicant, they can provide transcripts indicating they've completed an educator prep program to be eligible to receive licensure.

### Section by Section Analysis

#### Section 1. Section 272.8(1)

Amended to say that the board may issue a license to an applicant from another state or country if the applicant files evidence of the possession of any of the following:

- A full license from another state or country, which shall not include a temporary license or an emergency license.
- Verification from an institution located in another state that the applicant has completed all program and licensure requirements with the exception of any assessments required by the state.
- Transcripts indicating the applicant completed an educator preparation program located in another country.
