### Birth Certificates- Biological Parents

- HF 720 allows a person, who was adopted as a child to get a noncertified birth certificate that includes names of their biological parents if the names were omitted from the original birth certificate.

### Section by Section Analysis

#### Section 1 – Vital Statistics-Biological Parent Information- Amendment of Original Certificate of Birth (144.23A)

This new section allows an adult, who has been adopted, to add their biological parent to an original birth certificate by reestablishing the original. This does not replace the original birth certificate but does provide the adult with a reestablished noncertified copy of their birth certificate with their biological parent's name.

Standards for how this change is done are set in the section.

Clarifies that an adult, who was adopted as a child, can apply for and receive a noncertified reestablished original birth certificate with the biological parent listed.
