As I write this, my heart is heavy with the tragedy that unfolded in Nightcliff—the senseless killing of Linford Feick, a tragedy that should never have happened and has left our community devastated. Linford was more than just a small business owner; he was a cornerstone of our community. His kindness, consistency, and care helped bring people together, and he created a place of warmth and connection. As we mourn his loss, I know as a community we will continue to offer our full support to the Feick family and the incredible staff at the Friendly Grocer.

Over the past week I have been visiting local businesses and connecting with as many of you as possible to check in on how you are going, to hear what you need, and to understand what you hope to see happen moving forward. I know that many of you are feeling worried about your safety and I want to assure you that I am deeply committed to building a community that is safe for everyone.

### **Parliament**

In the March sittings of Parliament there were a number of bills passed which continue to undermine centralise power and including the democracy, Territory Coordinator Bill. Thank you to everyone who raised concerns about this Bill. In response, I moved 74 amendments to the Bill (spoiler alert, none passed!) based on the issues raised by people in our community and at the Scrutiny Committee hearings.

As your independent community representative, part of my role is to bring your voice into Parliament. I will continue to do this, and work to hold the government to account. If you are interested in knowing more about how Parliament works, you are always welcome to come into Parliament and watch, or follow me on social media where I post daily parliament updates.

### **Emergency April Sitting of Parliament**

The Chief Minister called an emergency Parliament sitting to change bail laws and amend the Youth Justice Act. I saw the Bill just hours before being asked to vote and had serious concerns it could make us less safe, not more. That's why I abstained.

I'm committed to safety for every Territorian, but I can't support laws I haven't had time to scrutinise or seek advice on—especially when rushed through in the wake of tragedy. That's not leadership or justice.

Thank you to those supporting thoughtful, evidence-based lawmaking. As an Independent, my job is to bring your voice into Parliament and to hold government accountable. I'll keep doing that every day.

#### Coming up in May

Parliament resumes Tuesday 13 May, when the Government will introduce the NT budget outlining its priorities for the year ahead. My hope is that this budget recognises that the economy is about people, not just numbers. For too long, budgets have focused on deficits and forecasts instead of people's real needs. We must invest in healthcare, education, the environment, and community safety—areas where the NT faces serious long-term challenges. Acting now will prevent greater harm and cost in the future.

We'll also debate legislation on the Attorney-General, Local Government, Domestic and Family Violence, Aboriginal Sacred Sites, Portable Long Service Leave, and Aboriginal Water Reserves.

In this coming sitting of Parliament, I am also planning to move a motion to set up an inquiry to recover the alleged 60 million dollars stolen from NT taxpayers through the Indigenous Employment Provisional Sum Scheme, money which should have been going towards Aboriginal employment.

We will also be debating my motion to reintroduce Voluntary Assisted Dying to the NT. If this is an issue that is important to you, please speak to me or your local Member for NT Parliament.

#### **Estimates**

Estimates occurs every June after the budget is presented. This is where MLAs can ask the Government questions about how public money is allocated, and whether it is being spent effectively and in line with priorities.
