

**Republican Party of Jackson County Wisconsin procedure for the Nomination of
committeemen/committeewomen.**

1. Statutory Authority. In accordance with Wisconsin Statute 8.17(5)(bm), candidates for party committeemen/committeewomen must file nomination papers to the county party to be elected.

2. Eligibility. To serve as a Republican committeeman/committeewoman, an individual shall be, at the time of filing nomination papers or at the time of appointment, a member in good standing of the Republican Party of Jackson County, a resident of the election district which he or she is chosen to represent, and shall be at least 18 years of age.

3. Nomination papers. Nomination papers consistent with forms authorized and used by the Wisconsin Election Commission shall be used by candidates to obtain nomination signatures from qualified electors.

(a) Each nomination paper shall have substantially the following words printed at the top:

I, the undersigned, request that the name of (insert candidate's last name plus first name, nickname or initial, and middle name, former legal surname, nickname or middle initial or initials if desired, but no other abbreviations or titles), residing at (insert candidate's street address) be placed on the ballot at the (spring or special) election to be held on (date of election) as a candidate so that voters will have the opportunity to vote for (him or her) for the office of (name of office). I am eligible to vote in the (name of jurisdiction or district in which candidate seeks office). I have not signed the nomination paper of any other candidate for the same office at this election.

(b) Each candidate shall include his or her mailing address on the candidate's nomination papers.

(c) All signers on each nomination paper shall reside in the jurisdiction or district which the candidate named on the paper will represent, if elected.

(d) Only one signature per person for the same office is valid. In addition to his or her signature, in order for the signature to be valid, each signer of a nomination paper shall legibly print his or her name in a space provided next to his or her signature and shall list his or her municipality of residence for voting purposes, the street and number, if any, on which the signer resides, and the date of signing.

(e) The certification of a qualified circulator under s. 8.15 (4) (a) who is a qualified elector of this state shall be appended to each nomination paper. The number of required signatures on nomination papers filed under this section is as follows:

4. Nomination Timeframe. Each November of even numbered years, the Republican Party of Jackson County Secretary will notify municipalities of the timeframe for the election of Republican committeeman/committeewoman for each municipality. The notification will include all applicable nomination forms and deadlines. Nomination papers may be circulated no sooner than December 1 preceding the election. Completed nomination papers must be filed with the Secretary of the Republican Party of Jackson County no later than 5 p.m. seven days prior to the Republican Party Caucus at which the election will be held. No extension of

the time for filing nomination papers applies, including in circumstances when a Party Caucus may be rescheduled.

5. Certification. The Republican Party of Jackson County Election Nominating Committee shall certify eligibility of candidates and elector signatures of complete nomination papers. The Republican Party of Jackson County Secretary may complete the certification in the absences of a Nominating Committee.
