

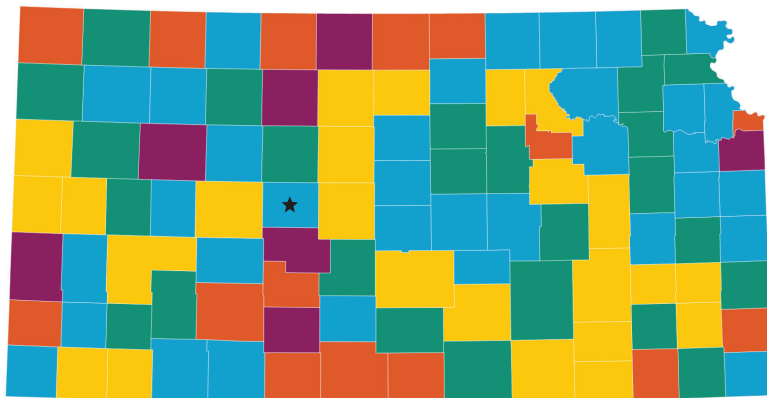

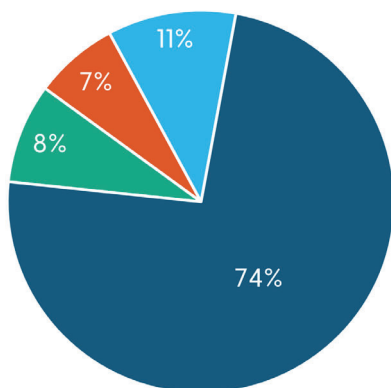

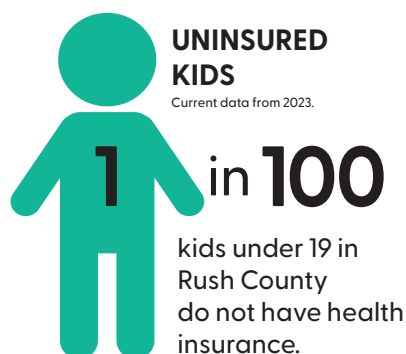
Poverty status of Rush County families.

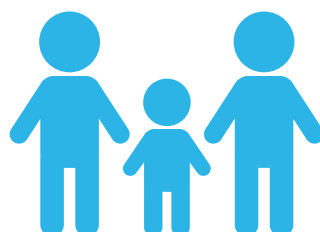
