# Our Team & Our Work





### Member Support

We provide technical assistance, data compilation, and training, including our Domestic Violence Advocate Certification Training, to strengthen how advocates, practitioners, programs, and communities serve and respond to survivors of intimate partner violence (IPV).



### Housing Program

We provide robust housing services, such as housing subsidies and case management, to survivors and collaborate on developing tax credit units to expand housing options for survivors. We also offer technical support to our member programs and other organizations involved in housing survivors. Our housing program's ultimate goal is to help survivors thrive.



We provide intervention services to support people who cause harm and prevention services through youth and community education. Our Education, Accountability, And Change for the Prevention of Partner Abuse (EACPPA) team administers the Batterer Intervention Program (BIP) and coordinates youth engagement services that take a restorative and transformative approach to ending IPV.



### Policy Advocacy & Communications

We advocate for and provide guidance on creating policies that center the lives and futures of survivors. Through direct and grassroots lobbying, as well as collaborative efforts with governmental, nonprofit, and advocacy organizations, we work across the aisle to ensure that the needs of survivors are considered in the policymaking process. We also connect Kentuckians to the work we do, the issues that matter, and the community-led solutions that positively impact survivors through events, awareness campaigns, communications, and nurtured relationships.
