Taking on a new challenge.

It has been my honour to serve as Parliamentary Private Secretary (PPS) to Keir Starmer for the past two years, facilitating the relationship between the Leader and members of the Parliamentary Labour Party (PLP) behind the scenes, and I am equally honoured to accept the appointment by Keir to be the Chair of the Commons Finance Committee. This committee considers expenditure on services for the House of Commons and has particular responsibility for the preparation and detailed scrutiny of the House's budgets. I will endeavour to ensure that every penny of taxpayers' money spent on the House (for example in procurement and contract management) meets high standards in its value for money. As Chair to this Committee, I will then also have a place on the House of Commons Commission, chaired by the Speaker, which is responsible for the administration and services of the Commons. I know that Jessica Morden MP, who is taking over from me as Keir's PPS, will be fantastic. I am very excited to be taking on this new challenge. I also look forward to having more time to campaign on the issues that are incredibly close to my heart, such as free school meals, battling ticket abuse and galvanising support for the Leamside Line campaign.

First meeting of Dyslexia and Other SpLDs APPG in 2023.

On Tuesday I chaired the first meeting in 2023 of the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Dyslexia and Other SpLDs. We attracted an impressive 82 attendees, In the meeting we explored a potential extension of the current screening provision in KS1&2 as a result of the new policy framework paper: Empowering our Teachers and the Children that they teach. A policy framework paper highlighting how a universal light-touch screener can be implemented by teachers for early identification of children's learning difficulties. During the meeting we were also able to discuss the topic of Early Identification of Dyslexia and Other SpLDs and the importance of early intervention and support to improving the outcomes for children and young people with SEN.

Last Friday, I visited Sainsbury's at the Galleries in Washington. I met with staff who have worked for the company for many years, one I had met had reached 46 years! Sainsbury's has engaged with the local community by donating food to School Breakfast Clubs, local charities and Washington Community Food Project. Sainsbury's also informed me about the work they are doing during the cost-of-living crisis. They have given staff a 10% pay increase in the past year, provided free food to staff during shifts and increased staff discounts around payday so they can stock up for the following month.
