



LEGISLATIVE SESSION 2026

Community Power In Action

Working class immigrant families delivered major policy victories in economic justice, immigrant rights, language access, civic participation, and community resilience.



OUR MAJOR WINS

SB 6346

Millionaires Tax

This landmark policy asks the wealthiest Washingtonians to pay what they truly owe in state taxes to support public services and working families. We played a larger leadership role than anticipated in shaping the final bill.

HB 2105

Immigrant Worker Protection Act

We led this bill, which protects workers and employers during federal immigration enforcement by requiring employer notification during I-9 inspections and directing the AG's Office to develop multilingual guidance.

HB 2355

Domestic Workers Bill of Rights

This legislation extends critical labor protections to domestic workers who have historically been excluded from many workplace protections. We stepped into a larger leadership role during the session.

SB 5925

Attorney General Civil Investigative Demands

This bill strengthens the Attorney General's enforcement authority. While broader in scope, this reinforces the state's ability to enforce protections under the Keep Washington Working framework.

HB 2475

Language Access

We lead the organizing to advance this bill, which strengthens statewide coordination around language access through the Office of Equity, helping ensure residents with limited English proficiency can access public services and programs.

Wildfire Response, Forest Restoration, and Community Resilience Account

The Legislature fully funded the \$60 million request for this account, supporting wildfire mitigation, forest restoration, and community preparedness programs across Washington.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND ADVOCACY

Community members and staff were actively engaged in legislative advocacy throughout the session.

Our policy leadership continues to grow.

This session demonstrated the organization's increasing role as a leading policy voice in Washington, particularly on immigrant rights, economic justice, and language access.

Coalition partnerships remain essential.

Nearly every major victory involved coordinated work across multiple advocacy organizations, community groups, and legislative champions.

Community participation strengthens advocacy.

Direct testimony, storytelling, and lived experience from community members were powerful tools in advancing policy priorities.

Future opportunities are strong.

Despite the loss of Alianza funding this session, we are well-positioned to return next year with stronger proposals and expanded leadership on several key bills.
