Ladies and Gentlemen:

Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line Company, LLC ("Transco") respectfully requests that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("Commission" or "FERC") Staff initiate the Commission's National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA") pre-filing review for Transco's proposed Southeast Supply Enhancement Project (sometimes referred to herein as the "Project"). The Project is an expansion of Transco's existing natural gas transmission system that will enable Transco to meet the growing natural gas-fired power generation, commercial, residential, and industrial demand in the mid-Atlantic and southeast United States. The Project is targeted to be placed in service by November 1, 2027.

The Project is proposed to provide 1,586,900 Dekatherms per day ("Dth/d") of new firm transportation capacity from Transco's existing Station 165 Zone 5 Pooling Point ("Station 165") and the Cherrystone Interconnect with Mountain Valley Pipeline located near milepost ("MP") 1413 ("Cherrystone Interconnect"), both in Pittsylvania County, Virginia. The Project capacity would be provided along four paths:

- 1,500 Dth/d originating from Transco's Station 165 and the Cherrystone Interconnect to Transco's existing Danville Meter Station located near MP 1393.33, in Pittsylvania County, Virginia;

- 300,000 Dth/day originating from Transco's Station 165 and the Cherrystone Interconnect to Transco's existing Eden Meter Station near MP 1382.5 and Transco's existing Dan River #2 Meter Station located near MP 1382.7, both in Rockingham County, North Carolina;
- 2,000 Dth/d originating from Transco's Station 165 and the Cherrystone Interconnect to Transco's existing Reidsville Meter Station located near MP 1377.73 in Rockingham County, North Carolina; and
- 1,283,400 Dth/day originating from Station 165 and the Cherrystone Interconnect to Transco's existing Station 85 Zone 4 Pooling Point located near MP 784.7 in Choctaw County, Alabama ("Station 85").

In accordance with Section 157.21(d) of the Commission's regulations, Transco submits the following:

1. A description of the schedule desired for the Project including the expected application filing date and the desired date for Commission approval.

Transco requests approval to commence the pre-filing process in February 2024. During the pre-filing process, Transco will identify and address relevant issues, meet with regulatory agencies, and seek landowner input. Transco will coordinate with Commission Staff to develop complete Resource Reports and expects to use a third-party contractor to prepare a draft environmental document.

Transco is submitting a complete draft of Resource Report 1, a full summary of alternatives, and a list of affected landowners and other stakeholders in conjunction with this pre-file request. Transco anticipates filing its NGA Section 7(c) certificate application on or about September 1, 2024. The application will request that the Commission approve the Project by February 2026 to meet the target in-service date for the Project facilities of November 1, 2027.

To summarize, the Williams proposed Project timeline is as follows:

Transco is seeking to use the Commission-approved pre-filing process to develop its certificate application and obtain timely processing of the certificate application. In that regard, Transco will provide to Commission Staff the information set forth in Section 157.21(f) of the Commission's regulations. Transco anticipates resolving issues raised during the scoping process and submitting a complete application.

2. For LNG terminal facilities, a description of the zoning and availability of the proposed site and marine facility location.

There are no LNG terminal facilities related to or proposed as part of the Project.

3. For natural gas facilities other than LNG terminal facilities and related jurisdictional natural gas facilities, an explanation of why the prospective applicant is requesting to use the pre-filing process under this section.

The Commission Staff's early review of the environmental document and its involvement in Transco's public participation plan will allow Transco, interested and valued stakeholders, and the Commission Staff to discuss and address routing, siting, and other environmental issues before developing and filing the certificate application for the Project. In particular, Transco believes that the pre-filing process will be beneficial in the following ways:

- Facilitating issue identification, study needs, and issue resolution;
- Conducting site visits, examining alternatives, meeting with agencies and stakeholders, and participating in the public information meetings (open houses);
- Issuing a scoping notice and conducting scoping for the Project; and
- Assisting in the review and comment on the Resource Reports comprising Transco's draft Environmental Reports prior to filing, to ensure that the Commission's filing requirements are satisfied and that all of the information needed to complete the environmental document is included.

4. A detailed description of the Project, including location maps and plot plans to scale showing all major plant components, that will serve as the initial discussion point for stakeholder review.

On June 19, 2023, Transco announced a non-binding open season and reverse open season for new year-round firm transportation capacity under the Project which would begin at Transco's existing Station 165 in Pittsylvania, Virginia and continue southbound to Transco's existing Station 85 in Choctaw County, Alabama. Transco has executed binding precedent agreements with the Project customers for the full 1,586,900 Dth/day of firm transportation capacity to be created by the Project facilities.

The Project facilities currently under review include the following:

Compression Facilities

- The addition of two (22,500 horsepower (“HP”) each) compressor units at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 165 located in Pittsylvania County, Virginia;
- The addition of one (23,465 International Organization for Standardization (“ISO”) HP) Solar Titan 130 Turbine and two (31,871 ISO HP each) Solar Titan 250 Turbine compressor units at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 155 located in Davidson County, North Carolina;
- The addition of one (15,900 ISO HP) Solar Mars 100 Turbine compressor unit at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 150 in Iredell County, North Carolina; and
- Demolition and removal of three (12,500 HP each) existing Electric Motor Driven (“EMD”) compressor units and replacement with three (33,000 HP each) EMD compressor units at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 145 in Cleveland County, North Carolina.

Pipeline Facilities

- Approximately 30.6 miles of 42-inch-diameter pipeline in Pittsylvania County, Virginia and Rockingham County, North Carolina (“Eden Loop”);
 - Regulator installation in Rockingham County, North Carolina near MP 1382.53;
 - Regulator installation in Rockingham County, North Carolina near MP 1382.70; and
- Approximately 24.0 miles of 42-inch-diameter pipeline in Guilford, Forsyth, and Davidson Counties, North Carolina (“Salem Loop”).

Facility Modifications

- Piping modifications at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 135 in Anderson County, South Carolina;
- Piping modifications at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 125 in Walton County, Georgia;
- Regulator installation and piping modifications at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 120 in Henry County, Georgia; and
- Piping modifications at Transco’s existing Compressor Station 105 in Coosa County Alabama.

The general location of the proposed facilities is illustrated on the attached project overview map.

5. **A list of the relevant federal and state agencies in the Project area with permitting requirements. For LNG terminal facilities, the list shall identify the agency designated by the governor of the state in which the Project will be located to consult with the**

Commission regarding state and local safety considerations. The filing shall include a statement indicating:

- (i) That those agencies are aware of the prospective applicant's intention to use the pre-filing process (including contact names and telephone numbers);**
- (ii) Whether the agencies have agreed to participate in the process;**
- (iii) How the applicant has accounted for agency schedules for issuance of federal authorizations; and**
- (iv) When the applicant proposes to file with these agencies for their respective permits or other authorizations.**

Transco has contacted federal and state agencies regarding the Project to introduce the Commission's pre-filing process and asked the agencies to participate in the process. Please refer to the attached *Initial Regulatory Contacts* table, which identifies the agencies that have been contacted regarding the pre-filing process and the results of those consultations. Transco will inform FERC Staff of agencies that express interest in participating in the FERC pre-filing process. Transco has incorporated into its overall project schedule the agency-specific schedules for issuance of required federal and state authorizations. A table outlining the anticipated federal and state authorizations for the Project is attached. Transco expects to file applications for all necessary federal permits concurrent with the filing of the Section 7(c) certificate application.

6. A list and description of the interest of other persons and organizations who have been contacted about the Project (including contact names and telephone numbers).-

Transco has begun meeting with select stakeholders, including landowners and local, state, and federal authorities, to identify and address concerns. In November 2023, Transco began contacting interested stakeholders, including state legislative and county government officials. In the coming months, Transco will continue meeting with local and state-level stakeholders and engage the U.S. congressional representatives whose districts will be affected by the Project. A list of stakeholders who have been contacted about the Project is attached.

7. A description of what work has already been done, e.g., contacting stakeholders, agency consultations, project engineering, route planning, environmental and engineering contractor engagement, environmental surveys/studies, and open houses. This description shall also include the identification of the environmental and engineering firms and sub-contractors under contract to develop the Project.-

Transco has contacted federal and state agencies to initiate consultation regarding potential impacts to resources. As noted on the attached *Initial Regulatory Contacts* table, Transco is attempting to schedule meetings with these federal and state agencies. Transco began outreach to affected landowners, as defined by the Commission's regulations, in Rockingham, Forsyth, Guilford, Davidson, Cleveland, and Iredell Counties in North Carolina and Pittsylvania County in Virginia in December 2023.

Transco has contracted with various engineering and environmental consulting firms to complete the surveys, studies, and drawings needed to support the filing of the permits and clearances required for the Project. These include:

- Pipeline Engineering – Hunt, Guillot & Associates, LLC
- Civil Survey – Paulus Sokolowski & Sartor, LLC, Burnett Group Inc, and Whiteley Technical Services LLC
- Biological Surveys, Cultural Resource Surveys, and Resource Report Preparation – GAI Consultants, Inc.

Transco initiated baseline environmental and cultural surveys in January 2024.

8. **For LNG terminal projects, proposals for at least three prospective third-party contractors from which Commission staff may make a selection to assist in the preparation of the requisite NEPA document.**

There are no LNG terminal facilities related to or proposed as part of the Project.

9. **For natural gas facilities other than LNG terminal facilities and related jurisdictional natural gas facilities, proposals for at least three prospective third-party contractors from which Commission staff may make a selection to assist in the preparation of the requisite NEPA document, or a proposal for the submission of an applicant-prepared draft Environmental Assessment as determined during the initial consultation described in paragraph (c) of this section.-**

Transco prepared a Request for Proposal (“RFP”) for a third-party contractor to prepare environmental documents. The draft RFP was reviewed by Commission Staff and issued to 11 prospective contractors. Transco is submitting to Staff under separate cover copies of 3 proposals for a potential contractor. Transco is prepared to execute the contract with the selected vendor immediately following approval to use the pre-filing process.

10. **Acknowledgement that a complete Environmental Report and complete application are required at the time of filing.**

Transco acknowledges that a complete Environmental Report and a complete application under Section 7(c) of the NGA will be required at the time of filing. Transco anticipates submitting the report and application to the Commission on or around September 1, 2024.

11. **A description of a Public Participation Plan which identifies specific tools and actions to facilitate stakeholder communications and public information, including a Project website and a single point of contact. This plan shall also describe how the applicant intends to respond to requests for information from federal and state permitting agencies, including, if applicable, the governor's designated agency for consultation regarding state and local safety considerations with respect to LNG facilities.**

Transco's commitment to stakeholder communications and effective public outreach on the Project is set forth in the *Southeast Supply Enhancement Project – Stakeholder Outreach Plan*, a copy of which is attached. Transco will respond to requests for information from participating federal and state agencies in a timely manner. Transco plans to host seven in-person open houses in Rockingham, Forsyth, Guilford, Davidson, Iredell, and Cleveland Counties in North Carolina and Pittsylvania County in Virginia, as well as one virtual open house option in March 2024.

For stakeholder communications, Transco has established a toll-free stakeholder telephone line at (888) 275-9084 as well as an e-mail address at growthproject@Williams.com. Transco's land agents will serve as points of contacts with landowners; they will also assist, as necessary, in public outreach efforts with local constituents affected by the Project.

In addition, Transco has established a public website for the Project at <https://wmb.link/yxr>. This website will be maintained throughout the Project and may include:

- Project overview
- Project location maps
- Route selection process
- Answers to frequently-asked questions
- Regulatory overview, with links to the Commission website
- Construction procedures
- Pipeline safety
- News
- Contact information

To further inform interested parties, Transco will periodically distribute *Project Update* electronic newsletters to interested stakeholders.

12. Certification that a Letter of Intent and a Preliminary Water Suitability Assessment have been submitted to the U.S. Coast Guard or, for modifications to an existing or approved LNG terminal, that the U.S. Coast Guard did not require such information.

There are no LNG terminal facilities related to or proposed as part of the Project.

Accordingly, Transco hereby requests that the Commission Staff initiate a pre-filing review of the Southeast Supply Enhancement Project.

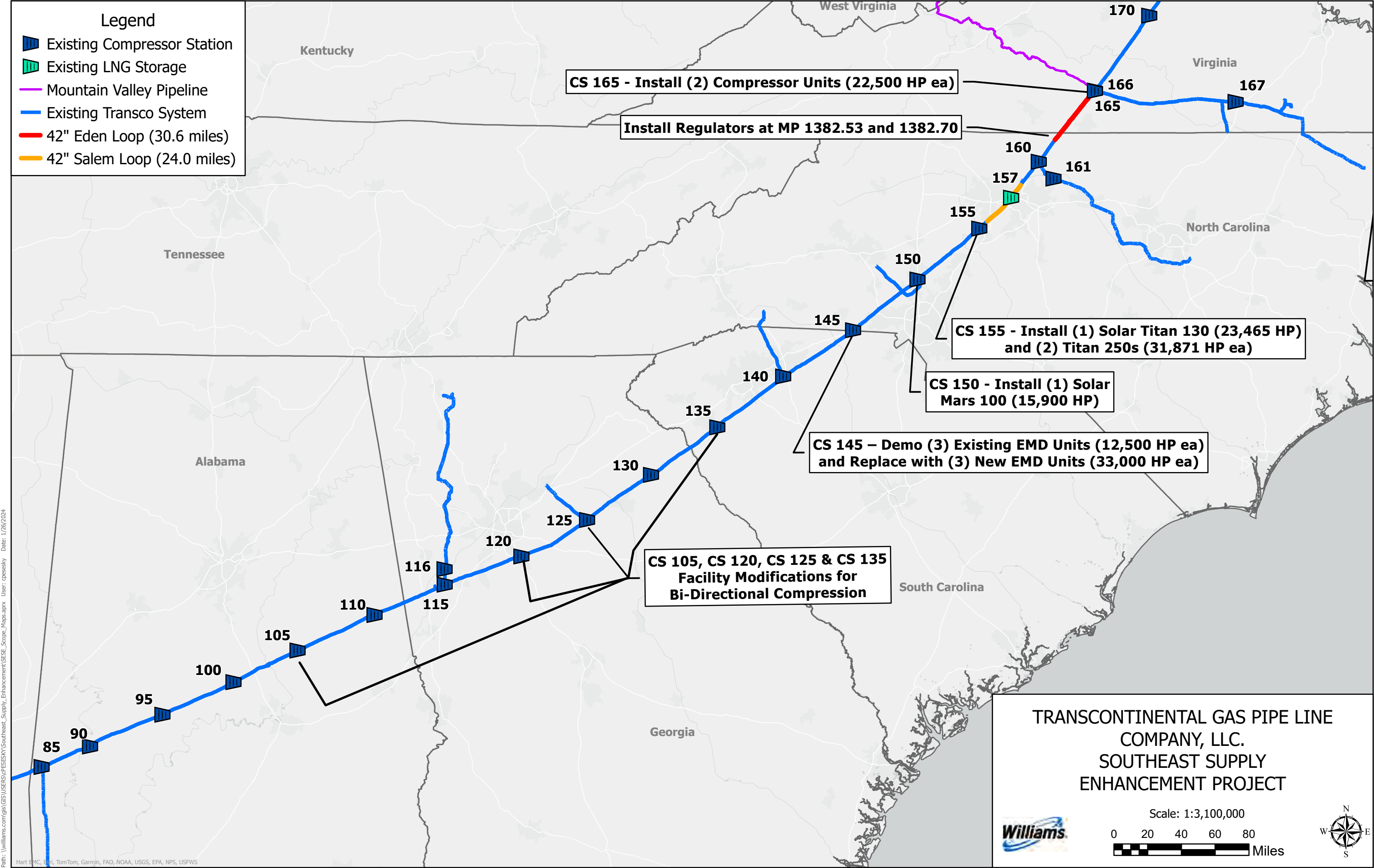

Southeast Supply Enhancement Project Outreach and Government Affairs Strategy



Project Summary & Analysis

This plan lays out the integrated strategy for outreach and engagement for Southeast Supply Enhancement. It is designed to enhance the overall effectiveness of our outreach and engagement efforts while strengthening our work to mobilize advocates to support the project publicly.

This plan is designed to support the successful completion Southeast Supply Enhancement (placed into service on time and on budget) by implementing strategies that educate and engage key stakeholders, law makers, and influencers on the purpose, need, benefits, and importance of the project. Additional focus will be placed on positioning Williams as a safe and reliable operator as well as a community and environmental steward.

This plan outlines team roles and responsibilities, the milestone goals, and the recommended strategies to accomplish those goals. The plan also includes tracking tools for engagement activities as well as measuring results and reporting mechanisms for various internal and external audiences.

This strategic plan is organized around the major regulatory milestones and includes recommended strategies for progressing through the regulatory process as well as building advocacy for the project and measuring potential outcomes for success.

Public Outreach Overview

Public outreach is the first step on the critical path for project management and execution and requires collaboration with every discipline needed to plan, design, operate, and maintain pipeline facilities.

Both Williams and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) believe that early involvement from stakeholders can help develop better overall project solutions. Stakeholders include any formal or informal group, organization, agency, elected official, community leader, and landowner, or identified individual who has a direct interest and/or involvement in the regulatory process and outcome of the project. An effective public outreach program can help neutralize opposition before, during, and after the construction of the project.

To that end, our project management strategies are directed toward engaging stakeholders early in the project process. The company's guiding principal is that stakeholders should hear about our projects from the company first and they should hear from us often.

Public outreach strategy includes:

- Early contact
- Frequent communication
- Listening and learning
- Information sharing and responding quickly to questions/request for information
- Being flexible when possible

Public outreach is much more than a mere notification. It is an opportunity to educate and provide information regarding the project and to develop active support wherever possible. A strong and credible outreach program requires building integrity and trust with members of the public who live and work in the project area as well as maintaining an effective coordinated communication effort between all disciplines needed to successfully execute the project.

Regional Risk Analysis

Southeast Supply Enhancement's scope involves a wide geographic area in Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and Alabama. The project includes pipeline looping adjacent to the existing Transco corridors and modifications to existing compressor and meter stations. An environmental justice assessment has been completed of the full project scope. Transco is assessing the potential economic benefits of the proposed project and is identifying local, county, and regional benefits. Further community outreach will need to be conducted to determine specific community needs and methods for addressing them.

Risk Mitigation

One major risk that has been identified for this project involves concerned neighbors. There is a possibility that larger opposition groups could team up with the local neighbors and landowners to create more attention on the situation. To mitigate this, outreach will begin early and often to alleviate any concerns that may exist among neighbors before a larger situation is created.

Identified Vulnerabilities

Below is a listing of the major vulnerabilities for the project. As research progresses, we will learn more and adapt our strategy laid out in this document which calls for these risks to be addressed based upon their risk profile.

1. **Customer Conversation:** The outreach plan needs to consist of a careful plan of messaging as it's been identified that languages other than English are spoken around compressor station areas.
2. **Localized Impacts:** The benefits of the project are not realized by those who are impacted. Instead, the impacts are born by those whose properties are impacted and benefits are seen by those outside the project area. Therefore, the risk is that impacted areas are not swayed by economic benefits including jobs, additional natural gas, and very limited tax revenues.

Environmental Justice Issues

Environmental justice continues to play a critical role in the approval of energy infrastructure projects. As a result, environmental justice will be considered and explored through an independent study of EJ issues across the project footprint. To conduct the research study, we have employed an Environmental Justice consulting firm who has guided and informed necessary outreach efforts to overburdened communities within the project footprint. Significant efforts will be made to ensure we engage community members who may typically be disenfranchised from outreach processes.

Office of Public Participation

In 2021, FERC initiated staffing an Office of Public Participation (OPP) which seeks to allow greater public interaction with the commission related to energy projects. Williams will continually monitor activities related to the development of OPP and will remain engaged with FERC commissioners (and staff) as the OPP is implemented. In the initial information session held regarding the OPP, several comments were provided by the organized environmental groups and landowner representatives concerning (as they described) unfavorable actions by oil and gas industry members related to landowners. Williams seeks to become a resource for the OPP and to enact best-in-class approaches to our outreach and engagement with stakeholders and landowners.

While the OPP creates a platform and the potential opportunity for active, organized environmental organizations to engage FERC in opposition to any relevant pipeline project,

Williams can seize the opportunity of the OPP to position the company, and our projects, in a manner that sets the bar for industry regarding how to conduct outreach, landowner negotiations, and overall project execution.

Outreach Risk Tracking

Included for each risk area will be an internal review of success indicators considered, relevant benchmark assessments or metrics, and risk mitigation strategies where applicable through the internal risk register process. Potential risk areas include:

- FERC Docket Status
- Landowner Engagement
- Oppositional Activity
- Customer Endorsement
- Permitting Success

Risk tracking will allow the Outreach team (and the project team and Williams' leadership team) to maintain an ongoing assessment of key public affairs risks (to the advancement of the project) and identify areas for risk mitigation, or public affairs opportunities. A risk level will be assigned to each success indicator, then aggregated to develop an overall status for project outreach. The risk levels include:

- High Risk
- Considerable Risk
- Perceptible Risk
- Slight Risk
- Minimal Risk
- No Risk

Indicator results will be assessed, and outreach strategies will be designed to maintain or improve current success indicators, decision drivers and key tactical adjustments. The internal risk register review will include input from project team members and will seek to provide an overall awareness of the current status of the risk indicators to Williams' leadership.

Research and Review

The Outreach and Government Affairs teams conducted initial research and outreach to help inform the project about the Environmental Justice impacts associated with the project at the local level. This work is supplemented by the EJ analysis performed by SWCA. Information gathered will be integrated into the communications, engagement, and outreach strategy, as necessary. The following is a summary of the findings from the study: *Southeast Supply Enhancement Environmental Justice Analysis*, issued November 14th, 2023 and modified on January 22, 2024.

Key Findings Include:

SWCA Environmental Consultants, working on behalf of the Williams Companies, conducted an environmental justice (EJ) screen for three existing compressor stations in the proposed route for the Southeast Supply Enhancement project. Out of the twelve block groups proposed for the project, seven are identified based on ethnicity alone, while two are recognized as environmental justice communities due to a combination of income and ethnicity.

Economic Impact Study

The Outreach team will be commissioning an economic impact study performed by a university, research institute or in-house, with efforts made to use a state or local resource. It will provide economic impacts by state, region, and county.

This economic impact study forms the basis for much of the information that is needed for outreach. Socioeconomics as well as many of our key messages related to the significant economic benefits a project such as this can provide to the local communities and elected officials. The study provides an estimate on the number of jobs and labor income that could be generated over the life of the project.

It also provides projected sales, income, and property tax revenue, broken down by county throughout the project area. The final report also includes an explanation of the methodologies used to calculate the impact as well as direct impacts, spillover impacts and a breakdown of the economics related to both the construction and operational phases of the project.

FERC Open Houses

The outreach team is planning on conducting six in-person open house meetings and one virtual option. Community members and neighbors will have the opportunity to attend one of these sessions to learn more about the Southeast Supply Enhancement project and ask any questions that they may have for the Williams team. Responsibility for this sector is shared by three parts of the project team working to develop and manage relationships at the federal, state, and local levels. Integration and close coordination are essential in this sector.

The federal government affairs team is responsible for relationships with all elected or appointed officials in the legislative and executive branches. State Government Affairs is responsible for managing all stakeholder relationships with state elected/appointed officials and their staff in the legislature and the executive branch. Lastly, local elected officials and their staff are managed by Strategic Outreach.

Regulatory

Responsibility for this sector is largely part of the environmental and permitting team. Yet, there is a clear role for the state government affairs team when dealing with appointees of

elected officials and managing political relationships with these officials. This requires close coordination and for the regulatory team to communicate often about the need for state government affairs to engage these stakeholders outside of what is called for in this plan.

Public Administration

The public administrative sector consists of the functions of government at all levels that is not elected, not associated with regulatory decision making and responsible for delivering the services of government that the community is expecting such as emergency response, public safety, road and infrastructure management, sanitation, etc.

Organized Interests

Most organized interests are managed by the strategic outreach team except in cases where State Government Affairs manages the relationships with certain state level associations or chambers of commerce. In either case, this requires close integration and coordination for each team to leverage the help of influential allies and organizations predisposed to champion the cause of the project.

A project web page has been developed to share information online as updates, open house dates, and other information becomes available about the project. We will utilize the use of digital advertising to spread information regarding the project and open house dates, as well.

Universal Components

The universal communication or engagement components are reviewed below as they relate to all stakeholders. Each of these communications and engagement tactics will be utilized with all stakeholders regardless of group.

Communications

The program will consider employing some if not all the following communications to all stakeholders and interested parties.

- Printed Letter or Post Card for Landowners & FERC Stakeholders

Project Briefings

These meetings focus on educating council and local officials, state lawmakers, environmental advocacy groups, community leaders, and other identified stakeholders about:

- Our company
- The advantages of natural gas as a clean energy solution
- The methods used to build and/or expand natural gas pipeline systems
- The scope of the project and early identification of potential routes

- The company's preliminary plans to meet customer requests through the proposed facility additions and any necessary modifications to existing facilities
- The regulatory process and major project milestones
- Opportunities for public input and how the company utilizes that input
- Other key messages as defined by the team

The goal of public outreach is twofold:

- 1) to educate the local officials about the company's efforts to design a project that meets the growing needs of the project customer and the region while minimizing environmental and public impacts.
- 2) to notify local officials of upcoming field activities in the project area and timelines for those activities including land agents conducting title searches in local court houses and tax offices, requests for survey permission from potentially affected landowners, and survey crews working on the project.

Informational Meetings

After the initial project briefings, our team will work to identify and meet with additional groups and community leaders that need to be informed about the project activities. The goal of public outreach at this stage is to continue to build relationships through planned engagement activities.

The following meetings and programs are additional touch points for county and local communities and great ways to follow-up after initial project briefings. These programs can be used as strategies to educate stakeholders and to disseminate information about the project and cultivate support.

- Follow-up meetings: These meetings are with state level, county, and townships regarding action items resulting from project briefings or informational sessions. These meetings are on request, on-going and in response to issue identification (often technical) arising as part of the regulatory process.
- Emergency responder meetings: These meetings are strongly recommended by FERC, and we treat them as an extension of our pipeline integrity program. Relationships with emergency responders is critical to our ongoing operations.
- Sponsorship of community events: The company will work with local communities to sponsor local events, organizations, festivals, fun runs, etc. as part of a defined community benefit program.
