PUBLIC NOTICE

Enbridge Energy, 425 West Superior Street, Suite 1100, Duluth, Minnesota 55802, has applied to this office for the following: A permit under authority of Part 303, Wetlands Protection, and Part 325, Great Lakes Submerged Lands, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (NREPA); Water Quality Certification under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act; and concurrence with the Consistency Certification submitted under Section 307 of the Coastal Zone Management Act. The applicant proposes to fill, grade, and construct within 1.53 acres of wetlands in Mackinac County on Point LaBarbe. Activities include building construction, construction laydown areas, tunnel portal construction, and road improvements within wetlands. Additionally, a water intake structure is proposed in Emmet County on McGulpin Point with 0.17 acre of associated Lake Michigan bottomland impact. This includes a 61-foot-long, 14-inch-diameter pipe extension where the intake line exits the lake bottom, and the intake structure which is proposed to be placed on a 12-foot-wide by 12-foot-long precast concrete pad. Up to 15 concrete ballasts, each measuring 48 inches by 24 inches by 40 inches, to weigh the intake pipe and structure to the lake bottom are also proposed. The water intake structure is proposed to remain on Lake Michigan bottomlands for the duration of construction, and all bottomland impacts from the intake are proposed to be eliminated following construction. A turbidity curtain is proposed around the entirety of the intake structure and pipe during installation and removal. The purpose of the project is to facilitate the construction of a tunnel beneath Lake Michigan bottomlands to replace the Line 5 dual pipelines crossing the Straits of Mackinac. All excavated materials are proposed to be placed at upland sites in Hebron Township, Cheboygan County; Moran Township, Mackinac County; and Wawatam Township, Emmet County. Excavated material will be placed outside of surface waters and wetlands. The project area is located in T39N, R04W, Section 10 in Wawatam Township, Emmet County and T40N, R04W in Moran Township, Mackinac County, Michigan in accordance with plans attached to this notice.

The proposed project may also be regulated by one or more additional parts of the NREPA that are administered by the WRD. The requirements of all applicable parts are considered in determining if a permit can be issued. When a permit application is received requesting authorization to work in or over the inland waters of the State of Michigan, pursuant to Part 303 and Part 325 of the NREPA, the NREPA provides that EGLE submit copies for review to the department of public health; the city, village, or township, and county where the project is to be located; the local soil conservation district; and any local watershed council organized under Part 311, Local River Management, of the NREPA. Additional notification is provided to certain persons as required by statute or determined by EGLE.

Those persons wanting to make comments on the proposed project shall furnish comments via MiEnviro, mail, or email no later than August 29, 2025. Comments will be made part of the record and should reference the above application number. Objections must be factual, specific, and fully describe the reasons upon which any objection is founded. The determination as to whether a permit will be issued will be based on an evaluation of all relevant factors, including the public comments received and the effect of the proposed work on the public trust or interest, including navigation, fish, wildlife, and pollution. The specific permit decision criteria can be found in the parts of the NREPA applicable to this application and listed above. Copies of these parts of the NREPA are available on the public notice Web site. Public comments received will also be considered.

This application will be reviewed by federal agencies in accordance with an agreement with the United States Environmental Protection Agency under provisions of Section 404 of the federal Clean Water Act Amendments of 1977.
