	The Chair invited Peter Bower to provide a summary of ELA 6442 and ELA 6443		
	 Mr Bower noted that his presentation will largely address relevant matters for both ELA6442 and ELA6443 together as the applicants are the same and the ELA areas are adjacent. When necessary the presentation will split to relevant information specific to each application Mr Bower highlighted that: 		
	 Narrabri Mine has been operational since 2011. In 2019-20 and 2020-21 it accounted for 2-3% of NSW's saleable production of thermal coal and approval of these applications could add 10 – 20 years to the life of the mine. 		
	 Both applications are for land in the area known as 'Gorman North', which has been identified for potential strategic release. A Market Interest process was conducted for the full Gorman North area, which includes both ELA6442 and ELA6443. No Market Interest submissions were received. 		
	 This application is validly made for the purposes of extending the life of a mine and developing a better mine design, as prescribed by the Mining Regulation as an operational allocation purpose. 		
	 The Resource Regulator notes a total of 15 non-compliance for each applicant, with the strongest action being court action, and there were several section 240 notices issued. On balance, the compliance matters are not considered significant enough to warrant refusal of the applications. 		

9 public comments were received covering both applications, raising impact on way of life, environmental concerns, aboriginal

	o	A conflict exists with the Secretary held title AUTH216. The Secretary provided consent to the applications being made over this title. It was noted that if approved, the EL(s) would part cancel AUTH216.
	0	Conflicts also exist with petroleum PEL238 and PPLA14. It was noted that if PPLA is granted, any coal mine design will consider impacts on existing gas production. It is proposed that a cooperation agreement would be imposed as a condition of licence.

The Chair noted:

- The assessment has been undertaken and all criteria are addressed in the documents provided.
- The ELAs are in the potential strategic release area of Gorman North identified under the Strategic Release Framework and whilst no market interest was expressed for the area, should the ELAs be granted, the Gorman North would no longer be viable for the development of a standalone mine.
- A commercial viability assessment determined that the viability of a standalone mine was marginal.
- Whitehaven's compliance history has received media attention. The Resources Regulator has assessed the applicant's compliance history and noted that it is considered a medium risk. A medium risk rating is triggered by any non-administrative contravention of relevant legislation and, following detailed consideration by the Resources Regulator and Titles Assessment units, the recommendation is that the noncompliances do not warrant refusal of the applications and to approve these ELAs.

Kevin Ruming noted:

- The Gorman North area is a high-quality thermal coal resource and was identified for potential strategic release.
- A commercial viability assessment was conducted to determine if the area could support a standalone mine. The report noted that the area could potentially support a standalone mine however margins would be small.
- The best return from Narrabri would be to access the coal from existing workings and infrastructure as the capital costs of getting to the coal would be high. When considered along with the lack of market interest, it makes sense to approve the ELAs.
