Libertarian Party of Nevada Files Most Candidates in 40 Years for An Election in The State of Nevada

Las Vegas, NV— Today the Libertarian Party of Nevada announced they've produced the largest slate of Libertarian candidates in 40 years for an election in Nevada. Following the candidate filing period, which ended, March 18th, 2002, the LPNV had 25 total candidates file for election in 2022.

"We've been dedicated to recruiting and training candidates over the past year, a strategic effort to get Libertarians elected" said Elections Committee Director Brandon Davis.

Voters across Nevada will see a Libertarian on the ballot in November 2022 in every statewide race, US Senate, US Congress, NV Senate, NV Assembly, and County & City races. These third options give voters an opportunity to have more choices outside of the two major parties.

This is a momentous shift for the State of Nevada, where the largest block of voters currently are non-democrat and non-republican. Davis said, "It's blatantly apparent that a majority of people in Nevada feel "politically homeless". We believe the Libertarian Party is that home, they just don't yet know it. We are the only party with candidates who will fight for the rights of all Nevadans, school choice, true criminal justice reform, reducing the burden of taxation, and so much more."
