Proposed Special Rules for Selection of candidates for LPN Executive Committee:

None of the above (NOTA) shall be considered a valid nomination and will be considered in order after general nominations have been closed.

After nominations have closed each nominee shall have the floor for not more than five minutes. Nominees may yield the floor during this period for a period of not more than two minutes to a member in support.

NOTA may be nominated from the floor after candidate speech periods. A member may speak on behalf of NOTA for no more than two minutes.

Elections shall be conducted in a run-off manner. If no candidate receives a majority of votes this shall result in the lowest vote total (excluding NOTA) candidate being removed, and a subsequent vote shall be taken with the remaining candidates.

All votes for officer's elections shall be recorded by written ballot.

In the event of NOTA ascending the office, that office may be considered once more for a general business item. In the event of NOTA ascending for a second set of nominations the position shall move forward as NOTA.

Proposed Special Rules for Approval of Executive Committee Appointment of Nominees for Vacancies for Partisan Public Offices:

Motion to adopt a temporary policy to exist until March 2nd, 2024:

To permit the Executive Committee of The Libertarian Party of Clark County, Nevada to amend the List of Candidates for Partisan Public Office in order to allow for the Nomination of members to fill Partisan Public Office Nominations left Vacant from the 2022 Clark County Convention. All amendments to the List of Candidates for Partisan Public Office shall require a Majority vote of the Executive Committee.

Proposed Special Rules for Bylaws Amendments:

Bylaws amendments as written shall be debated for a period of not more than eight (8) minutes before the Chair shall call the measure to a vote. The proposing member shall not be allotted more than four (4) of the eight (8) minutes. Should the vote fail, the floor shall be reopened for not more than ten (10) minutes to consider amendments to the agenda item. At the end of the ten minute period the chair shall close the floor and call for a final vote with any approved amendments from the floor.

Proposed Special Rules for Limiting Debate on Motions:

After a motion has been moved and seconded members can take the floor to speak in favor or opposition of the motion for not more than three minutes. Members can speak a second time for not more than two minutes only after every member who wishes to has spoken for the first time.
