



# Voting In Person

**Early Voting:** June 11–18, 2026 **Election Day:** June 23, 2026

## 1. Decide whether to vote on Election Day or during Early Voting

- Do what works best for your job, home, child care, or travel schedule.

## 2. On Election Day, you must go to your assigned precinct to vote.

- To find your assigned precinct, go to [Vote411.org](https://Vote411.org) and enter your address.
- If you are at the wrong precinct, you will be asked to vote a provisional ballot, but you will still be allowed to vote that day.
- Polls are open from 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM on Election Day.

## 3. During Early Voting, you can vote at any Early Voting location in your county.

- To find early voting centers in your county, go to [Vote411.org](https://Vote411.org) and enter your address.
- **Early Voting hours are 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM** daily, including Saturday and Sunday.
- No sign-up is required — just show up during voting hours.

## 4. Steps for voting are the same for Election Day and Early Voting.

- You will stop at a check-in table where an election judge will ask your name, address, and the month and day of your birth.
- For the primary election only, you will be asked your party, so you get the right ballot.
- You will mark your ballot using a pen that will be on the table, or you can choose to use a “ballot marking device” where you can mark your ballot on a screen, which will print — but not record — your choices.
- You will put your ballot through the scanner to get counted.
- Election workers are there at every step to help you.

## 5. You can register and vote on the same day if you are new to voting in Maryland.

- Bring proof of who you are (such as a Maryland driver’s license or state-issued ID) and proof of address (such as a paycheck, bank statement, or utility bill).
