# 2025 Annual Meeting Recap

### **Highlights of the Annual Meeting:**

During her opening remarks, President Laura Mettle expressed deep appreciation for the League's lifetime members, whose service remains a cornerstone of our organization. She was thrilled to announce the addition of over 30 new members since April 2024, a clear indicator of the League's growing relevance and reach. Laura highlighted the League's commitment to forging alliances with like-minded groups to champion democracy and civil rights, ensuring that our collective voice remains strong and effective.

Treasurer Jessica Rose Malm's report assured members of the League's continued financial stability. As of late April, our accounts are healthy, with \$14,236.16 in checking and \$32,289.58 in our money market fund. Jessica explained that the adoption of the new national dues collection platform, Chapter Spot, will bring about changes in how we report our finances for 2025-2026.


The League is energized by the appointment of new committee members for 2026, including the Nominating, Budget, and Bylaws Committees. President Mettle stressed the importance of updating our bylaws to reflect current needs and best practices. The nominating committee's diligent work led to a unanimous vote for a new slate of officers and directors, ensuring strong leadership for the coming term. With these dedicated individuals at the helm, the League is well-equipped to drive forward its advocacy and voter education programs.

#### **Grace Kubofcik**

It is with great sadness that the HC League of Women Voters shares news of the passing of longtime LWV member and community advocate Grace Kubafcik following recent surgery. Grace joined the LWV in the 1980s, was elected co-President in 2007, and served with distinction in a variety of both board and off-board positions over the last 40 years. Also an important contributor to and supporter of the Association of Community Services, Patapsco Heritage Greenway, EC250, and HC Affordable Housing Coalition, she made a significant difference wherever she served.

Grace was an advisor, mentor, and educator to elected officials and community members who wished to understand the history, challenges, and intricacies of county processes. Grace was always happy to share how we got here, where we should be going, and what it would take to get us there - together.

She either knew it all or would not stop asking questions of those in charge until she did. When Grace testified before the General Assembly, County Council, or local Boards & Commissions, everybody listened because no one was more respected by leadership, colleagues, or even the loyal opposition.

From her strength of character, commitment to facts, and a lifetime of hands-on experience, Grace always knew what was the right thing to do, and had no trouble making a compelling case for action, and holding people responsible when what should happen did not. Always more than willing to do the work necessary to bring together those who could and should make it happen, she never gave up.

A true friend and advocate for strengthening community, she was an original. We were blessed to have her in our lives and shall not see her like again. Our condolences go out to her family, friends, and everyone she knew.
