GOVERNOR WES MOORE

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Wes Moore is the 63rd Governor of Maryland, making history as the state's first Black Governor and only the third African American elected Governor in U.S. history.

Moore was born in Takoma Park, MD to Joy and Westley Moore. After his father died of a rare, but treatable virus when Moore was just three, his family moved to the Bronx to live with Moore's grandparents, before returning to Maryland when Moore was 14.

Moore graduated from Valley Forge Military Academy and College with an Associate's degree in 1998, and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army. He earned his Bachelor's in international relations and economics at Johns Hopkins University, where he graduated Phi Beta Kappa and became the school's first Black Rhodes Scholar. As a Rhodes Scholar, he earned a Master's in international relations from Oxford University.

In 2005, Moore deployed to Afghanistan as a lieutenant with the 82nd Airborne Division, leading soldiers in combat. Immediately upon returning home, he served as a White House Fellow, advising on issues of national security and international relations.

In 2010, Moore wrote *New York Times* bestseller *The Other Wes Moore*, a story about the fragile nature of opportunity in America. He went on to write other best-selling books that reflect on race, equity, and opportunity, including *Five Days*, which centers on Baltimore in the days that followed the 2015 death of Freddie Gray.

Moore built and launched BridgeEdU, a Baltimore-based business that reinvented freshman year for underserved students to boost their long-term success. It was acquired by the Brooklyn-based student financial success platform, Edquity, in 2018.

Moore's commitment to tackling tough challenges brought him to the Robin Hood Foundation, where he served for four years as CEO. During his tenure, the Foundation distributed over \$600 million to lift families out of poverty, including in Maryland.

While the Robin Hood Foundation is headquartered in New York City, Wes and his family never moved from their home in Baltimore. Moore has also worked in finance with Deutsche Bank in London and with Citigroup in New York.

Moore and his wife, First Lady Dawn Moore, have two children – Mia and James – and a dog, Tucker Balti.
