Parliament is in full swing and most of most days I am in Ottawa working on issues impacting Canadians. I frequently fly back to Pitt Meadows-Maple Ridge on weekends to attend events and meet with residents. I continue to be honoured to represent you in this role.

I offer my congratulations to our two new Mayors, Nicole MacDonald in Pitt Meadows and Dan Ruimy in Maple Ridge. I also congratulate all new and reelected councilors for both cities. I look forward to working together with them on your behalf. Thank you to all who participated in this democratic process at the local level. I will be presenting Platinum Jubilee medals to all who served on the previous councils and school board in appreciation of their efforts over the past four years.

In Parliament, Conservatives have been proposing common-sense solutions to help address the affordability crisis Canadians are facing. Inflation is at its highest rate since 1983 and interest rates have jumped to their highest levels since 1998.

The Liberal government, supported by the NDP, voted against a Conservative motion to cancel an upcoming TRIPLING of the Carbon Tax. The price of food has increased by 11.4% the highest spike since 1981. British Columbians are already paying the highest gas prices in North America. This increase in taxes will also make it more expensive to heat your home and will raise costs on food and everything else. The numbers going to our local food bank is up dramatically. I am very concerned about this and the negative impact it is having on so many seniors and residents in Pitt Meadows and Maple Ridge.

- If the caller claims to be a law enforcement official, hang up and call your police directly.

- Be careful what you post online. Scammers can use details shared on social media platforms and dating sites for targeting purposes.
- Be suspicious of telephone calls that require you to immediately take action and request bail money for a family member in distress.
