THREATENS FREEDOM OF SPEECH & PRESS

Bill C-18, or the Online News Act, has now passed. This Bill controls online news platforms. Liberals claimed it would address "misinformation and disinformation," although the definitions of what this means is not clear. This new law will have harmful consequences for Canadians.

1. Threat to Freedom of Speech and Press

The Bill grants significant powers to the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) to regulate online news platforms. CRTC now has the authority to impose fines, and shut down platforms that fail to follow their regulations. The CRTC can now shut down dissenting voices and limit access to information that is critical of the government.

2. Lack of Clarity and Potential Overreach This new law's lack of clarity opens the door to subjective interpretation by regulators and the Liberal Government. It could result in arbitrary enforcement and the stifling of free speech.

3. Burden on Small Independent Publishers

Bill C-18 could disproportionately impact small independent publishers and individual content creators who rely on online platforms to share their news and opinions.

In addition, Facebook and Instagram are now blocking news for Canadian users because of this Bill. Google has indicated they will do the same.






What YOU had to say.....
