A MESSAGE FROM YOUR MP

Dear Neighbour,

With Autumn upon us, students are now back to school. There's usually a buzz of excitement as classes begin. For nearly three decades, I was a teacher in Pitt Meadows-Maple Ridge at both the secondary and elementary levels. I applaud all the teachers and staff who work hard to instruct our youth and make education interesting. It is very rewarding work, but it can also be very demanding.

Did you know that the average bill for back-to-school shopping in Canada is \$700 per student?

Numbers released by Deloitte indicate the cost of school supplies has increased 24% in the last 2 years.

StatsCan expects the biggest price shock to parents will be the increased cost of lunch box staples. Bread, rolls, and buns are up 8.1%. Apples are up 7.8% this year. Cookies and crackers are up 12.4%.

This extra stress placed on the family budget means families are cutting back on extracurriculars and vacations. According to Capital One, 45% of Canadian households making less than \$60,000 a year are foregoing essential items and 14% of Canadians anticipate they will have to go into debt just to pay for school supplies.

Costly Liberal/NDP government policies have made back-to-school more expensive for Canadian families. As a result of their inflationary policies & taxes, Canadians are worse off, and life is less and less affordable.

My Conservative MP colleagues and I are calling on the government to axe their inflationary tax on everything and ensure Canadians bring home powerful pay cheques that are not eroded by inflation and taxes.

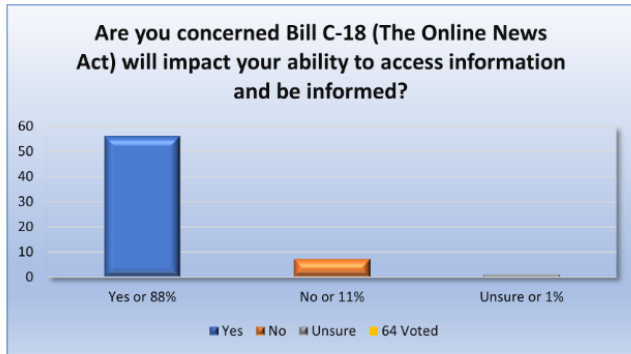

Stressful time for mortgage holders

Interest rate increases are hammering British Columbians. Are you one of them?

I've been talking to residents in Pitt Meadows and Maple Ridge who are seeing their mortgage payments skyrocket. One lady told me that she needs to look for another job on top of the one she has to meet the doubling of her housing costs. Another young couple told me they can no longer travel like they used to.

Those on VARIABLE rates felt the interest rate increases immediately. For everyone else with a mortgage, the extra cost will be felt at renewal.

How have we come to this?

The government has lost control of its spending and doubled Canada's national debt. They claimed taking on this debt was cheap because interest rates were low.

Conservative Leader Pierre Poilievre warned that this would lead to **INFLATION**. He was mocked by the Liberals and NDP but it's now obvious he was right. The government panicked and raised interest rates by 1000%!
