Summary

Thanks to the generosity and passion of thousands of supporters, Binary is set to make a significant impact on the upcoming Victorian election. This community survey confirms that the issues of parental rights and the transgender agenda play a significant role in voters decision making.

The survey was conducted in June 2022, and sought a sense of the community sentiment in four prominent Victorian electorates, each held by government MPs.

Premier Daniel Andrews' seat of Mulgrave, Mary-Anne Thomas's seat of Macedon, Tim Pallas' seat of Werribee, and Paul Edbrooke's seat of Frankston.

This community survey is not a weighted opinion poll, rather it is a wide-lens take on local views.

We spoke to 2700 voters, seeking to understand both awareness and support for key issues in the transgender debate, we asked eight questions on four topics: voting intentions, gender ideology in preschool, gender transitioning without parental consent, and biological males in female sports.

Responses indicate that, though higher than expected, awareness on the issues of gender ideology in preschools and transitioning without parental consent is low. Despite this, support for the woke ideology is even lower. Respondents adamantly oppose schools and preschools indoctrinating children and undermining parental rights.

Awareness of males competing in women's sport was higher than the other issues, but voters were overwhelming in their opposition. It is clear that those we spoke to want to keep women's sport safe, fair and strictly for women.

Each of the four Labor MPs saw a decrease in support, suggesting community ill-will towards the government. Most notably, voting intention responses in Mulgrave suggest that support for Premier Andrews has dropped since 2018.

Though this is only a survey of a small portion of the electorate, it does give a sense of the attitudes within these communities.

The results of this survey can't be ignored by Victorian politicians: Victorians overwhelmingly reject radical gender ideology.



SEAT RESULTS

Seat Result: Mulgrave - Dan Andrews (ALP)

- Awareness / Support of the preschool issue 44/13
- Awareness / Support of the transition / parental consent issue 32/9
- Awareness / Support of the sport issue 65/11
- TP Vote intention 36/49 Libs +13

While awareness of transgender issues was consistent with other findings, overall support was the lowest of the four seats surveyed. Around just one in ten of the Dan Andrews' constituents support teaching gender issues in preschool or biological males competing in women's sports. On the issue of transitioning students without parents consent, just one third was aware it was taking place, and less than 10% supported the practice.

The Premier's seat of Mulgrave in Melbourne's east saw the most notable voting intention change in our survey. 38% told us that they voted for Dan in 2018, while only 36% said they planned to again. The biggest shift came in support for the Liberal party. While just 40% voted for the Libs in 2018, 49% said they planned to in the upcoming election, giving the Liberal party a 13 point lead over Andrews.

Seat Result: Macedon - Mary-Anne Thomas (ALP)

- Awareness / Support of the preschool issue 49/22
- Awareness / Support of the transition / parental consent issue 33/14
- Awareness / Support of the sport issue 75/20
- TP Vote intention 30/37 Libs +7

Awareness of the issues was higher in Macedon than in the three other seats. A full three quarters of respondents were aware of biological men playing in women's sport, half were aware of gender ideology in preschools, and a third were aware of school transitions without parental consent. Despite the high level of awareness, support for the issues was consistently low. Just two in every ten voters

support preschoolers learning about gender and men playing women's sport. Just 14% say they are on board with transitioning kids behind their parents backs.

Sitting MP Mary-Anne Thomas of the ALP saw a 5% drop in intended support, picked up by the Liberal Party, giving the Libs a 7 point lead over the incumbent.

Seat Result: Werribee - Tim Pallas (ALP)

- Awareness / Support of the preschool issue 32/10
- Awareness / Support of the transition / parental consent issue 21/10
- Awareness / Support of the sport issue 60/18
- TP Vote intention 33/32 Lab +1

Of the seats surveyed, Werribee in Melbourne's south-west had the lowest awareness of the transgender issues. Less than one third knew about gender ideology in preschools, just 20% were aware of transitioning without parental consent, and only 60% knew about men playing in women's sport. Despite the low awareness, support for those issues was even lower. Just one in

ten voters support the issues of preschool curriculum and transitioning without consent, while only 18% were ok with men playing women's sport.

Werribee was the only seat surveyed where the incumbent ALP MP maintained a lead. Despite a 9 point drop, Tim Pallas still leads the Liberal support by 1.

Seat Result: Frankston - Paul Edbrooke (ALP)

- Awareness / Support of the preschool issue 50/14
- Awareness / Support of the transition / parental consent issue 32/10
- Awareness / Support of the sport issue 72/28
- TP Vote intention 36/38 Libs +2

The seat of Frankston had the highest overall level of issue awareness in our survey. Half of respondents were aware of gender teaching in preschool, though only 14% supported it. A third were aware of transitioning in schools without parental consent with only one in ten in favour. More than 70% were aware of men

playing women's sports, and nearly 3 in ten supported it.

Current ALP Member Paul Edbrooke saw the lowest drop of any incumbent in our survey, dropping just 1 point to his Liberal opposition, giving the Libs a two point lead.
