What is a Vulnerable Road User?

Massachusetts now defines "vulnerable user" on our roads to include: people walking and biking; roadside workers; people using wheelchairs; scooters, skateboards, roller skates, and other micromobility devices; horse riders and horse drawn carriages; farm equipment

Safe Passing

 Motorists must now give a "safe passing distance" of 4 feet when passing Vulnerable Road Users

Bicyclist Light Requirement

- When riding at night, bicyclists must use a white front light, a rear red light, and a rear red reflector
- Police officers <u>cannot</u> use a light violation as a reason to stop a bicyclist

Truck Safety Devices

 State-contracted trucks are required to be equipped with safety side guards, mirrors, and backup cameras to reduce fatalities of people walking and biking

Safer Speed Limits

 The process for municipalities to lower speed limits on statecontrolled roads has been clarified to allow for local decision making

Crash Reporting

 To improve statewide data collection surrounding vulnerable road user crashes, a publicly available standardized analysis tool will be used to report crashes and incidents involving a vulnerable user and a motor vehicle

These changes to MA laws will save lives on our roads!
