

After analyzing the provided studies, the S.B. County Wonder Inn Project Planner published a NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT AN INITIAL STUDY/MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION. Wonder Valley residents are responding asking for a complete Environmental Impact Report (EIR) under CEQA to fully inform the public and decision makers.

The Planner originally gave 21 days to read and respond to the 1000 pages of studies. Approximately 145 residents called fowl (wrote letters) and the time was increased to 31 days.





Land Use and development was based on the 5-acre Small Tract Act 1938-1976


It is famous for the Jackrabbit Homesteads which include many falling down cabins as well as many that have been refurbished.






Environmental Justice – Wonder Valley Population Characteristics

On May 8, 2012, the California Attorney General's office released a report entitled "Environmental Justice at the Local and Regional Level – Legal Background" which interprets existing law to impose environmental justice obligations that local governments must consider when approving specific projects and planning for future development

"Environmental justice" is defined in the Government Code as "the fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies."

"Fairness" means that "the benefits of a healthy environment should be available to everyone, and the burdens of pollution should not be focused on sensitive populations or on communities that already are experiencing its adverse effects."




Wonder Valley is between JTNP and Amboy Crater






Wonder Valley Gateway to Mojave Trails – Mojave Preserve & Death Valley or Las Vegas

Dust sources include 3 solar facilities (350 acres), Copper Mountain College, Coyote Dry Lake, dirt roads and where vegetation has been removed.


Active Sand Sources – red circles Emerson Dry Lake Lucerne Dry Lake


Wonder Valley CSA 70M maintains, for a \$50 service fee on 4,634 parcels, 178 miles of dirt roads, very attractive to adventure seeking tourists.



Facts

CSA 70 M WONDER VALLEY was established by an act of the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors on August 14, 1972 to provide road maintenance for 178.41 miles of road to the community of Wonder Valley. This road zone is located 10 miles east of Twenty-Nine Palms and receives a \$15 service charge currently billed on 4,634 parcels of land to fund its maintenance service. This zone has a Board appointed Advisory Commission and utilizes the Wonder Valley Community Center for meetings.

Environmental Justice


Residents with asthma and cardiovascular conditions suffer from dust. The regulated speed to keep the dust down and preserve the road grading is 15 to 25 mph.



Desert Tortoise - YES

Circle Mountain Biological Consultants (CMBC) Focused Survey for Agassiz's Desert Tortoise, Habitat Evaluation for the Burrowing Owl, and General Biological Resource Assessment for a 40-acre+/- Site (APN 0625-071-04 & 09) in the community of Wonder Valley, San Bernardino County, California Job#: 20-012 April 2020 – Ed LaRue

"Based on the presence of tortoise signs found onsite, as depicted in Figure 3, CMBC concludes that Agassiz's desert tortoise occurs onsite, both in undeveloped creosote bush scrub habitats to the south and the adjacent, centrally located jojoba field. Based on the size and freshness of scats, we conclude that the one subadult tortoise observed near the east-central portion of the site is currently resident and an adult tortoise is using scrub areas to the south and the central jojoba field."





However,

ELMT Consulting /Wonder Inn Joshua Tree Habitat Assessment submitted for the Project.

"Despite a systematic search of the project site, no live tortoises, suitable burrows or signs

"Despite a systematic search of the project site, no live tortoises, suitable burrows or signs was observed on the project site during the site investigation. Based on the results of the field investigation and lack of suitable burrows and no observed sign, desert tortoise was determined to have a low potential to occur onsite." March 25, 2021


The CMBC survey was not submitted to S.B. Co. Land Use for analysis of the project. Pat Flanagan sent the survey to the Wonder Inn Planner and others including Ed LaRue, CMBC. His reply to the email:


Thank you for ccing me. I have not had a chance to review the survey subsequent to ours, which was performed in 2020, but I understand from you that no tortoise sign was found during the subsequent survey performed in July 2021. I've been surveying for tortoises for 33 years, since 1989, and don't see any way, whatsoever, that we would find tortoise signs in 2020 and they not persist there one year later, in 2021, particularly since there was a wealth of juvenile tortoise signs; juveniles are an age class that is less likely to travel long distances as subadults and adults may be prone to do. Even if there had not been any new tortoise scats deposited, the ones we found in 2020 should still be visible, even in 2023, three years later. I've attached a map of the signs we found in 2020. It's probably apropos of nothing, but my partner, Sharon Dougherty who is cc'd, informed me yesterday that we were never paid for the 2020 biological survey we performed.

Wonder Valley is TORTOISE HABITAT and must be protected

Residents of Wonder Valley are familiar with tortoise on their property. With geolocated pictures, it was possible to map their presence in the area.

Always check under your car before driving off.








Desert Tortoise General Conservation Plan
