> AB 1573 – Support Letter Re:

Dear Chairperson Bauer-Kahan:

On behalf of the undersigned, we are pleased to support AB 1573, which would eliminate the use of non-functional turf and sets the strongest level of water conservation requirements for new or major rehabilitated non-residential landscapes, including requiring all nonresidential projects to use 75% local native plants for the project's landscaping footprint after January 1, 2026. It would also create a definition for "local native plants."

California is at the forefront of climate change, as it experiences the real-time impacts of extreme weather, water shortages, and the nation's highest levels of species loss. Action is needed now to conserve natural resources while protecting the state's remarkable biodiversity. This bill helps unite a growing body of California public policy aimed at water conservation, biodiversity protection, and urban greening.

Today, roughly half of all publicly supplied water is used primarily for landscape irrigation, and much of that irrigation is potable water used on non-functional turf, and turf is the number one irrigated crop in the United States. Moving to native plant landscapes will realize reductions in energy use, water use, and greenhouse gas emissions based on reduced inputs and maintenance needs of these landscapes.

This bill would also further Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-82-20 that establishes a state policy to protect biodiversity and take action to make our state more climate resilient through state agency action that promote biodiversity protection, habitat restoration, wildfire-resilient, sustainably managed landscapes and other conservation outcomes.

AB 1573 takes an important first step into ensuring that future landscaping will benefit California's climate resilience and biodiversity conservation efforts by setting requirements for non-residential landscaping that will promote the use of drought-tolerant native plant landscaping.

For these reasons, we support AB 1573 and urge an "Aye" vote.
