Freeholder Kenneth Armwood is a lifelong resident of Piscataway Township, and is a graduate of Rutgers University. He started his career in public service at age 19, when he was elected to the Piscataway Township School Board. Following his service on the School Board, Mr. Armwood was elected to the Piscataway Township Council, where he served from 2005 to 2013 and as president from 2008 to 2013.

As a councilman, Mr. Armwood was instrumental in the renovation of Quibbletown Park, which was made accessible for children with and without disabilities so the children could play together, leading to the creation of one of the most unique and inclusive parks in the State.

Appointed in 2013 and subsequently elected, Mr. Armwood joined the Middlesex County Freeholder Board. He is the Chair of the Middlesex County Business Development and Education Committee. The Middlesex County Business Development and Education Committee is responsible for fostering the County's economic, artistic, and educational developments. Under his leadership, the County has created a Business Portal, an interactive GIS based economic development tool that provides resources for business owners and investors. He has also introduced SkillUp Middlesex, a free, online tool for county residents to enhance skills and obtain industry recognized credentials, offering 4,500 free, online courses. He has also introduced an Annual Business Summit, which the County holds to bring together leaders in from across the business community to build partnerships and collaboration for the benefit of County residents.

Freeholder Armwood also serves as the liaison to Middlesex County College and the Middlesex County Vocational Technical School System. He served on the Middlesex County Task Force on School Violence, which created an emergency response manual for schools throughout the County. This Task Force has since been used as a model for a state program.

Freeholder Armwood also oversees administration of the Cultural and Arts Trust Fund, which was created by the Board of Chosen Freeholders in 2015. This fund allocates \$10 million

each year to expand arts and cultural venues and programming across Middlesex County, and is the largest commitment to arts and culture by any County in the State.


