Regan Deering of Decatur announced her bid for the 88th Illinois House District seat on June 14th at the McLean County Republicans HQ in Bloomington. She hopes to follow state Rep. Dan Caulkins (R-Decatur), who will be stepping down from that position at the expiration of his term, honoring a commitment to serve up to three terms in that capacity. Rep. Caulkins introduced Mrs. Deering to about 30 attendees and endorsed her candidacy. He noted she would be "the best candidate to promote our conservative

values." He also described her as very effective and someone who would energize the Republican base of the 88th District.

While announcing her candidacy, Mrs. Deering stated that her motivation for running was her "concern about the future of my family." She serves on her local Mount Zion school board. She espouses the values of "freedom, responsibility, hard work, and compassion for the underprivileged." She promised to fight for conservative "values, interests and causes" to benefit all her constituents.

She said, "I'm a mom, an educator, and a small-business owner," referring to her former business, where she had 100 part-time employees. She believes, "We can no longer sit on the sidelines when the culture war is a problem, and parents are losing rights," and insisted "our rights and values must be protected." Mrs. Deering willingly took questions from the audience, and one of the attendees asked about her stance on the Second Amendment, and Mrs. Deering noted that she is a "strong defender" of Second Amendment rights.

The 88th Illinois House District consists of portions of McLean, Macon, DeWitt, and Piatt counties. The urban cores of Bloomington-Normal and Decatur are not part of the district, though the outlying regions of those towns are included.

McLean County Republicans are seeking liberty-loving men and women to serve as Precinct Committeemen

In an excerpt, Charles Swindoll writes, "George Bernard Shaw's statement frequently flashes through my mind: "Liberty means responsibility. That is why most men dread it." Those words bite and sting in a day of passing the buck with merely a shrug. It's one thing to sing and dance to liberty's tunes, but it's something else entirely to bear the responsibility for paying the band.

The precinct committeeperson (PC) has been called "the most powerful office in the world" because the PC is the closest structured political officeholder to the registered voter. PCs are the backbone of the local party. PCs are elected by the people of the precinct in which they reside. Only Precinct Committeepersons can vote on the internal Party policy. A PC elects the county, district, and state party officers, delegates to the Presidential convention, and RNC members. PCs sent to the Presidential Convention also vote on the policies the party platform will advocate in the next two years.

Across the nation, over 400,000 PC positions are available in the Republican Party. Only about 200,000 of these positions are filled. With only about 50% of these important positions filled, our party is running at half-strength. McLean County Republican Party is no different from the national average. We want to fill open PC positions with people who love liberty and are willing to get involved to see positive change in McLean County.

If your precinct does not have a person serving as the Republican PC and you are interested, there is a straightforward application process to complete. At this time, an interested person can be appointed as a PC by the Republican County Chair. You must be a registered voter in your precinct and 18 years of age.

Featured Recipe - Pioneer Woman's Apple Dumplings

(Serves 4-6, prep time 15 minutes, bake time 40-45 minutes)

INGREDIENTS

- 1 large apple {| used a Fuji any apple will do; tart is better}
- 1 can Pillsbury Crescent dough
- 1/2 cup butter
- 3/4 cup or 6 oz. of 7-Up or equivalent

- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1/2 tsp vanilla

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease an 8"x8" baking dish. Cut each apple into 8-10 wedges. Slice the apple skin off as well and set aside. Separate the crescent roll dough into triangles. Fold each apple wedge in crescent roll dough, starting at the wide end. Pinch to seal and cover the apples and place them in the baking dish. (It is easier to pat the apple wedge dry, then wrap dough around it.)

Melt butter in a small saucepan and stir in the sugar and cinnamon. Heat, whisking to combine. The mixture will slowly combine and thicken. When it's thickened, remove it from the heat and add vanilla. Pour the cinnamon mixture over the apple dumplings. Pour soda over the dumplings. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes in the preheated oven or until golden brown.
