Featured Recipe – Fried Fruit Hand Pies

(Yields: 24; Total Time: 2 hours)

Editor's note: I recently returned from Michigan, where I experienced "fried fruit hand pies – apple, cherry, blueberry, and raspberry. They were excellent. To help share in the joy of "fine dessert dining," I am sharing with you a variation taken from Oklahoma.

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE ALL-BUTTER CRUSTS:

2 1/2 c. unbleached all-purpose flour 1 tsp. kosher salt

1 tbsp. granulated sugar 1 c. cold unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch pieces

1 c. cold water 1/4 c. cider vinegar

a :

1/2 c. ice

FOR THE HAND PIES:

1 whole large egg 1 egg yolk

2 tbsp. milk or water 1 12-oz. can of blueberry pie filling

1 12-oz. can of strawberry pie filling 1 48-oz. can of Crisco shortening for frying

1 c. confectioners' sugar for dusting

DIRECTIONS

FOR THE ALL-BUTTER CRUSTS:

Stir the flour, salt, and sugar together in a large bowl with a flat bottom. Add the butter pieces on top of the dry ingredients. Using your fingers, toss the butter in the dry mixture so each cube is coated. Use a pastry blender or your fingers to cut or rub the butter into the mixture until it is in pieces a bit larger than peas (a few larger pieces are okay; be careful not to over-blend). You want big butter chunks in your crust: It helps create a flaky effect and adds delicious buttery hints of flavor! (cont. page 2)

Featured Recipe - Fried Fruit Hand Pies-cont.

Combine the water, cider vinegar, and ice in a separate large measuring cup or small bowl. Sprinkle 2 tablespoons of the ice water mixture over the flour mixture; do not add the ice, which is just there to keep your water cold. Using your hands in a circular motion, bring the mixture together until all the liquid is incorporated. Continue adding the ice water mixture, 1 to 2 tablespoons. Carefully mix until the dough comes together in a ball, with some dry bits remaining. Turn the dough onto a lightly floured surface and knead gently until it comes into one mass; you don't want to overwork it. Separate the dough into two equal portions, shape each into a flat disc, wrap in plastic, and refrigerate for at least 1 hour, preferably overnight, before using. Wrapped tightly, the dough can be refrigerated for 3 days or frozen for up to 3 months. Thaw frozen dough overnight in the fridge.

FOR THE HAND PIES:

Egg wash: Wisk the egg, yolk, and milk or water in a quart container until smooth.

Roll the dough: Roll the dough into sheets that are 1/8 inch thick. Using either a 2-by-2-inch square scalloped cookie cutter or a pizza cutter, cut the dough into 48 2-by-2-inch squares.

Assemble the hand piesa heaping tablespoon of pie filling into the center of a square of dough. Brush the edges of the dough with egg wash and then place another square of dough on top, pressing the edges to seal the pocket. Place on a baking sheet. Repeat with the remaining dough and fillings to make 24 hand pies. Refrigerate until ready to fry.

Fry the hand pies: In a large heavy-bottom pot over medium-high heat, melt the Crisco and bring it up to 350°F. Fry the hand pies in batches of 2 or 3, flipping each halfway through until both sides are golden brown for 3 to 4 minutes. Drain on paper towels to soak excess oil and sprinkle with sifted confectioners' sugar.
