Illinois Supreme Court Justice Lisa Holder White

Justice Lisa Holder, White of the Supreme Court of Illinois, is a Decatur, Illinois, native, the daughter of Marvin and Corinne Holder. She attended Decatur Public Schools through third grade and the Macon Public Schools until 1986, when she graduated from Macon Community High School. Justice Holder White graduated Magna Cum Laude from Lewis University in Romeoville, Illinois, in 1990 with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. She earned her Juris Doctor degree from the University of Illinois College of Law in Urbana-Champaign in 1993. (cont pg 2)

Her first legal position was as an Assistant State's Attorney for Macon County, where she handled a wide range of cases from traffic violations to felonies. Later, she worked as an Assistant Public Defender, litigating on behalf of individuals accused of criminal offenses and representing abused and neglected children. After gaining experience in the criminal justice system, Justice White enjoyed a thriving practice at the Decatur law firm, then Brinkoetter & White. She focused her practice on family and criminal law.

With this background, she was appointed Associate Judge in 2001, becoming the first Black judge in the Sixth Judicial Circuit. During her term as an Associate Judge, she was instrumental in securing and implementing the Redeploy Illinois Grant to reduce the incarceration rate for nonviolent juvenile offenders.

In 2008, the Illinois Supreme Court appointed her Circuit Judge to fill a retirement vacancy, and in 2010, she was elected to the position. In this role, she served as Supervising Judge of the Criminal Division.

Again selected to fill a vacancy, Justice White was sworn in as the first Black member of the Illinois Appellate Court, Fourth District, on January 14, 2013. In 2014, she was elected to a full term on the appellate court.

On July 7, 2022, Justice White was sworn in as a Justice of the Illinois Supreme Court, the first Black woman to hold this position. Justice White has been active in judicial education, professional leadership, and public service.

In addition to her service to the legal profession, Justice White is dedicated to giving back to the community. She has been a member of the Decatur Public Schools Foundation boards, the Mid-Illinois Chapter of the American Red Cross, Millikin University, and the Community Foundation of Macon County. She served on the Project Success Right Track Truancy Roundtable, a group formed to address local truancy issues. She participated in Varsity Goes to City Hall, a group that paired high school students with professionals working in the students' areas of interest.

Justice White enjoys hosting mock trial programs to expose young people to the justice system and encourage those interested in a career in the law. Justice White has welcomed university and law school students into her chambers as externs. Working with the Girl Scouts, she has hosted activities that allow scouts to meet and learn from women who are judges, police officers, attorneys, court reporters, and probation officers. As part of the Illinois Supreme Court's efforts to expose the public to the state's legal history, Justice White participated in the Illinois Supreme Court Historic Preservation Commission's program, presenting a "retrial" of the famous insanity trial of Mary Todd Lincoln. Another such program addressed "The Alton School Cases," and Justice White was a member of the panel discussion of these milestone cases.

Justice White is a member of Antioch Missionary Baptist Church, where she serves on the Culinary Committee and enjoys singing in the choir. She and James, her husband of thirty-five years, are the proud parents of Brett and Myah.

McLean County Chair Remains in Republican Hands

In a party-line vote on September 14, the majority of the McLean County Board voted to elect Catherine Metsker (R) to replace John McIntrye (R) as Chair of the McLean County Board. McIntyre retired earlier in the month due to unspecified health reasons. The vote was nine in favor versus eight opposed.

Long-time Board member Chuck Erickson (R) nominated Metsker, citing her 38 years of residency in McLean County and nine years of experience as a Board member. In addition, Erickson noted, Metsker has served for three years as chair of the McLean County Board's Finance Committee. She also has served on the Board's Executive Committee and the Health Committee. Metsker hails from Carlock.

Though some Democrats called foul, Republicans smartly played the rules to keep the Chairmanship of the McLean County Board in Republican hands, believing that the chairmanship position should not flip between parties due to the unfortunate health-related resignation of its former chair.

A crowd of supporters and wellwishers gathered on August 30 to meet with Illinois Supreme Court Justice Lisa Holder White. Justice White shared her passion for service as the 4th Judicial Supreme Court Justice. The gathering was held at Rob Dob's Restaurant in Bloomington.

Featured Recipe – Hot German Potato Salad

(Yields: 8-10 servings; Preparation Time: 1.5 hours)

INGREDIENTS

4 or 5 large Russet or Burbank Russet potatoes 1½ tsp salt

10 slices of bacon ¾ C apple cider vinegar

½ C chopped onions1½ C water3 T flourCelery seed

3 T granulated sugar Chopped boiled eggs, parsley, and pimentos (optional)

DIRECTIONS

Place enough potatoes to fit in the bottom of a kettle loosely. Boil for about one hour or until the skins crack and loosen. Remove from the water and cool. Fry the bacon and set aside. When cool, crumble the bacon into small pieces. Remove most of the grease from the pan, retaining about 2-3 tablespoons. Place chopped onion in the pan and cook until transparent and slightly browned. Add flour and stir under heat until flour has been cooked. Add sugar and salt, followed by vinegar and water. Stir until warmed through. Add celery seed. Bring sauce to a slow boil until thickened. Slice potatoes into sauce and heat through, gently mixing. Serve warm.

Editor's note: This recipe is a perfect accompaniment for autumn outdoor cookouts consistin of a grilled entrée, sauerkraut, cinnamon apple sauce, baked beans, corn on the cob, and more. It's a very popular side dish at family potlucks.
