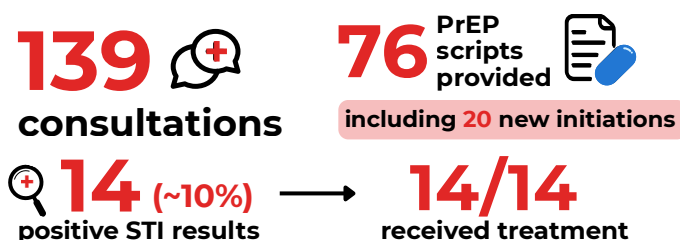


Canberra's Testing Context
