Intros & Moderation by Janet Stearns

State Senate District 36 Michael Grieco

- Issues affordable housing and public safety
- Winnability we have a messaging issue, we need to speak plainly to NPA voters
- His state senate seat covers Central Miami-Dade County; individual candidates need to take responsibility for their own races rather than depending on a ticket-wide strategy
- Questions: What is your messaging strategy? Running as a law and order moderate
- Will proactively message to the Hispanic community
- Inflation We need to turn this back on the Republicans

State Senate District 38 Janelle Perez

- Issues: health care access, housing affordability, education, environment
- Biggest obstacle the messaging is too complex,
- Fundraising strategy there is traction outside of Florida to raise money by previewing that what is happening here is going to be national
- Question: how do you convince voters that won't vote for you because you are gay: I won't try and win them
 over, but it is important to be visible
- Question: how to you counter the socialism narrative? I talk about how capitalism has benefited me personally
- Question: Reactions to don't say gay? This is an overly broad bill
- Question: How do you address that you used to be a Republican? Life transforms people.

• State House District 114 Adam Benna

- Issues: Affordable housing, rising energy costs, and property insurance
- What can you do in Tallahassee to help? Things will get done as Democrats get elected
- Major issue: fixing the insurance industry by limiting lawsuits
- Running an independent campaign
- Question: is tort reform the way to fix the insurance problem? The problem is field adjusters
- Question: how do you connect with younger people? Affordable housing. The State Legislature keeps raiding the affordable housing fund.

State House District 113 AJ D'Amico

- Issues: Health Care, Climate Change, Affordable Housing
- Wants to advocate for a climate change infrastructure package
- Biggest challenge: organizing at the grassroots level
- Question: access to Solar: we need to phase out net metering
- Question: What can be done to make housing more affordable: municipal grant program which would encourage municipalities
- Question: What do you think is the best way to message on climate change? Climate change is non partisan
- How to get involved: sign petition to get him on the ballot; volunteer to canvas
