IV. Presentation by Miami-Dade Democratic Party Voter Protection Team Chair Wayne Brody

Mr. Brody began by letting all present know how important our voter protection work is. There are now former members of the Proud Boys serving on the Republican Party Executive Committee here. Voting laws have been passed by Republicans in the Florida State Legislature and signed by Gov. DeSantis Florida making it more difficult to vote, which is why the work of this team is so important. According to Politico, out of 20 counties across the country which will have an out-sized impact on the mid-terms, the largest is Miami-Dade. The team is looking for volunteers to:

- -serve as poll watchers, observing activities at the polls
- -roving poll watchers who will go to sites not covered all day
- -covering two dozen new polling location this season
- -observe how new laws are being implemented
- -volunteers being recruited now will be trained by the Voter Protection Team
- -Spanish speakers are essential
- -Volunteers must be registered Democrats

Florida Senate District 36 Candidate Raquel Pacheco https://raquel.vote

Raquel Pacheco is running against current District 37 State Senator Ileana Garcia. Ms. Pacheco is a former member of the Connecticut National Guard, a small business owner, and current member of the City of Miami Beach Personnel Board and president of Miami Beach United.

- endorsed by Ruth's list
- eight year-old son in public school
- pro-choice
- will fight to remove 15 week abortion
- endorsed by Planned Parenthood
- believes Ileana Garcia is too extreme; no abortions, no exceptions and for open carry of weapons

Former Florida Legislator and US Congress District 28 (was 26) Candidate Robert Asencio - www.ascensioforcongress.com

Robert Asencio was a US Army Reservist and who served for 26 years in the Miami-Dade County Schools Police Department. He was state representative for district 118 from 2016-2018 and currently works as a political consultant. He faces progressive Juan Paredes in the August primary and, if he wins that, will face sitting Republican congressman Carlos Gimenez.

Victor Vazquez is a US Air Force veteran and a retired Professor of History at Miami Dade College. Mr. Vazquez has been a member of the Miami Springs City Council since 2021, to which he was elected in a 70 percent landslide. Mr. Vazquez is running for the district 6 seat being vacated by the term-limited Rebecca Sosa. Since the commission race is non-partisan, he will be facing three republican challengers in the primary. Our first job is to make sure that Mr. Vazquez makes it on to the November ballot.
