



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The Junior Ambassador program has continued to grow to give high school students in Miami-Dade and Broward counties the skills and knowledge necessary to be advocates and environmental stewards for their communities. Through advocacy trainings, community service activities, and citizen science projects, Junior Ambassadors learned about the issues and threats facing Biscayne Bay and its surrounding waterways. Through civic engagement, they practiced making their voices heard and advocating for solutions to make a positive change in the environment.











RESEARCHERS IN ACTION

Junior Ambassadors engage in research throughout the year, participating in various citizen science projects. This year, Ambassadors participated in EarthEcho's water quality program, collecting data on Miami's water quality for an international data collection project. Students also worked with International SeaKeepers Society to clean up marine debris for the Ocean Conservancy's Clean Swell App, which tracks trash that's cleaned up from beaches around the world to help researchers better tackle the issue of marine debris. These hands-on experiences allow students to investigate their expansive watershed in new and exciting ways while collecting data for researchers and Biscayne Bay monitoring initiatives.

FLOATING CLASSROOMS

This year's Junior Ambassadors went aboard the River Queen and spent a morning on Biscayne Bay. Ambassadors learned about the different types of pollution that are degrading Biscayne Bay and used EarthEcho kits and a YSI sonde to test water quality. They also explored Biscayne Bay with an underwater drone donated by the Wildlife Conservation Society and cleaned up marine debris on Pelican Island.
