Last week, the DNC's new Transition Advisory Committee met in-person at the DNC headquarters in Washington D.C. I met my fellow committee members and we discussed the purpose and structure of the committee. (As a reminder, the committee is charged with (1) building a Party that reaches into and represents every corner of America; (2) expanding and strengthening partnerships, identifying outreach opportunities, and bolstering grassroots organizing; and (3) communicating effectively across all channels and spectrums.)

Committee members also spoke directly with DNC Chair Tom Perez for nearly 90 minutes about our initial thoughts and ideas, including new staff hires, changes to the DNC structure, reimplementing the 50 State Strategy, and supporting state parties. Throughout the entire meeting, there was an across-the-board focus on the need to revamp our messaging, including how we communicate with potential small-dollar donors and voters. I raised ideas about ensuring a 50 State Strategy by bringing DNC staff to the states, rethinking how we message our core Democratic values, and improving the DNC's transparency.

While in D.C., I attended a recording of Democrats Live, a new weekly Facebook livestream show featuring Democratic and progressive leaders from around the country. Moderated by DNC Deputy Chair and Congressman Keith Ellison, and featuring DNC Vice Chair and Congresswoman Grace Meng and NARAL President Ilyse Hogue, the panel discussed the state of women's reproductive rights. Reaching Out and Mobilizing Core Democratic Constituencies Working Group

Shortly before we met in D.C., committee members were informed of their placement in four working groups within the larger committee. These working groups are:

- · Building lasting coalitions with progressive groups and other Democratic allies
- Organizing and winning in red & rural states
- Strengthening state parties & creating new entry ways
- · Reaching out and mobilizing core Democratic constituencies

I was selected to the working group in charge of reaching out and mobilizing core Democratic constituencies. The first conference call of this working group is in the next few days, and we will be discussing answers to the following questions:

- What do you consider the core Democratic constituencies?
- What are the policies that are most important to each of these constituencies?
- What are the message areas you would like to see tested to mobilize each of these core constituencies?
- Who are the experts we should be talking to about mobilizing each of these constituencies?
- How can we better engage with ethnic media?
- · What are the Republicans doing well to talk to our core constituencies?
- What has the DNC done well in the past to mobilize each of these core constituencies?
- What has the DNC done poorly in the past to mobilize each of these core constituencies?
- What role does technology play in mobilizing core constituencies?
