Christ at the Heart

"The Church Enhancement Committee, formed by Fr. Jim Gartland in 2022, was given the task of enhancing the sacredness, dignity, and beauty of our sanctuary. Pope Francis wrote that "every expression of true beauty can thus be acknowledged as a path leading to an encounter with the Lord Jesus" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 167). The aim is not decoration for its own sake, but the creation of a space that fixes our gazes heavenward.

SACREDNESS

Under the proposed plan, the tabernacle will move to the center of the sanctuary, directly behind a newly carved wooden altar, in keeping with diocesan guidelines. There is long Jesuit precedent for this. For centuries, Catholic churches kept the tabernacle hidden behind rood screens. When the Society of Jesus built its mother church, the Gesù in Rome, it placed the tabernacle at the center in view of the congregation—a layout repeated in hundreds of churches as the Jesuits expanded across Europe and the Americas. This placement draws the congregation's eye, emphasizing the Eucharist as not only the heart of the physical sanctuary, but the heart of the Christian faith itself.

Additionally, carved screens will flank the tabernacle, and behind them will be a small prayer area. At present, there is no dedicated space where the faithful can pray before the tabernacle without distractions. The new space will be close to the Eucharist and out of view, so that those who approach the Blessed Sacrament to pray can do so undisturbed. Both this space and the choir's new location were proposed during the 1992 capital campaign but never carried out.

DIGNITY

The rectangular altar platform will be replaced with a semi-circular one, close in shape to the platform installed in 1966 after the Second Vatican Council. A curve will open outward toward the

assembly, making the sanctuary less stage-like and more inviting. That openness, plus the central placement of the tabernacle, will remind us of the universal love of Christ—He desires to dwell in the hearts of His people rather than be confined to a concealed space. Furthermore, the next article in this series will elaborate on the sanctuary's accessibility. Ramps and an ambo that can be raised and lowered will make the sanctuary usable by everyone who wants to minister there.

BEAUTY

Mike Kapetan, who designed our crucifix, will carve the new altar furnishings with motifs drawn from devotion to the Blessed Mother, the Eucharist, and the Holy Spirit. The apse wall behind the altar will be painted in a Marian blue that is also, conveniently, a Michigan blue, drawing attention toward the crucifix and the altar. New lighting and a new sound system will further support our worship of the Lord.

The choir will move to the William Street side, near where the tabernacle stands now. As one of our piano accompanists, I (Ryan) find this change especially meaningful. Singing from behind the altar keeps the musicians separate from the congregation and can be a distraction during the liturgy. The new location should make it easier for the choir to lead, and easier for the parish to sing together.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324). This truth drew me (Jaden) to be the Liturgy & Prayer Peer Ministry Intern last year and gives the sanctuary modifications a deeper meaning. These changes, particularly creating a central, intimate space for the Blessed Sacrament, is a beautiful physical representation of Christ as our own spiritual heart.

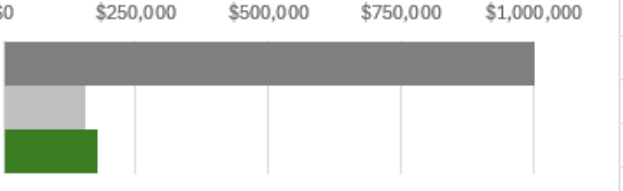
