SEASON OF CREATION: A REFLECTION ON LIVING WATER

We are blessed at St. Mary parish to live within the world's largest freshwater system, the Great Lakes. About 21% of Earth's freshwater is contained within these five lakes. Flowing over 2,000 miles to the Atlantic Ocean, 40 million people share this connected resource. And so ecological, economic, political and spiritual decisions about the care of these waters ultimately affect all Great Lakes life. The Anishinaabe (original peoples), who have lived here for about 10,000 years, believe that Great Lakes waters are a living, sacred spirit and lifeblood of the Earth. Bringing this wisdom together reveals a vast "Living Water" vital for all God's creatures.

Through work experiences and raising a family in Michigan I became concerned about how we share and care for the Great Lakes. I chose a mid-life career change to work on these water issues. More important was the movement within me, the desire, to connect my present awareness of God's gift of the Great Lakes with the older larger story that water is sacred for all life and for being a Christian.

My work at the Great Lakes Commission, an interstate water agency, connected me with people from Minnesota to New York. Seeing how millions of people must share this one resource transformed my awareness of the sacred role of Great Lakes water. Also, by sharing this work with others we grew together in awareness of Great Lakes as "Living Water".

I am grateful how these experiences have transformed my relationship with Jesus. Jesus began his ministry with baptism in the River Jordan. Though my efforts have been small I am more deeply aware how the waters of my baptism had/have a sanctifying role as a follower of Christ.

When Jesus encountered the Samaritan woman he referred to himself as "living water" (John 4:10) that would nourish her spiritually. With the symbol of water the prophet Isaiah called to the people: "All you who are thirsty, come to the water..." (Is 55: 1). Though water satisfies our physical thirst every day, water also reminds us of a deeper thirst for awareness and desire to follow Jesus. And reverence for Great Lakes waters can transform how we know our Creator God as the Source of All Being.

During September our parish will celebrate a Season of Creation: "Living Water". Below are special opportunities for learning more about our freshwater systems and actions to help care for these. Events centered on the theme "Living Water" will be featured all year round. Please stay tuned.

St. Mary will be celebrating the Season of Creation September 1 – October 4.

During this Season, we join our sisters and brothers in the ecumenical family in prayer and action for our common home. This year's theme is "Living Water". St. Mary will be offering special events all year to explore this theme in our local community and promote care for our common home. To mark the occasion, some upcoming special events include:

All are Welcome, All Belong

Our Centennial theme celebrates a community where all are welcome and all belong. We are a remarkably diverse parish made up of a multitude of cultures, races, languages, generations, and abilities. Our parish community reflects a beautiful mosaic of God's family. This unique blend of ages and backgrounds strengthens our faith and expands our hearts.

As a parish committed to being open to all, we must ensure that our physical space allows us to live out our inclusive mission, particularly in the sacramental life of our community. Therefore, the Church Enhancement Committee has proposed modifications that we hope will create a church sanctuary that better embraces the diversity of our parish in two significant areas:

Interculturality

Two new banners will be installed on each side of the sanctuary to reflect the culturally diverse expressions of Marian devotion at our parish. On one side will be a banner for Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, the patroness of St. Mary Student Parish. On the other side will be a banner of Our Lady of Guadalupe, which will be rotated with various other banners featuring Marian devotions from around the world, such as Our Lady of Kibeho from Africa or Our Lady of Manaoag from the Philippines. Through these banners, we honor, welcome, and celebrate the various traditions of our culturally diverse parish.

ADA Accessibility

In November 1978, a full 12 years before the U.S. Congress passed the Americans With Disabilities Act, the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops issued a "Pastoral Statement on Persons with Disabilities." The bishops believed it was important to include persons of all abilities so that they could exercise

their baptismal rights, serve the Church and each other with their talents, and grow in their relationship with Christ. Vatican II likewise emphasized full, conscious and active participation for everyone at Mass.

Over the years, St. Mary has made advances in accessibility through exterior and interior ramps, accessible restrooms, elevators, and Assistive Listening Devices for persons with hearing impairments, all the while balancing the many budget demands of a growing student parish. Still, we have much room for improvement, especially in our worship space.

The success of our ongoing Capital Campaign now allows our parish the opportunity to move even closer to achieving full liturgical access and participation for all persons, regardless of their physical ability. The new design provides ramps with access to the altar, sacristy, tabernacle and choir; a wheelchair accessible and adjustable height ambo that provides a comfortable reading height for our shortest to our tallest Lectors, including the children who participate in Family Faith Formation; a new, fully accessible confessional (in the church!) that is compliant with Safe Environment Standards to protect children and vulnerable adults. A parishioner's height, or use of a wheelchair, walker or cane will no longer prohibit their full participation in the sacraments or liturgy.

By removing barriers to make room for all of our brothers and sisters, and by incorporating more culturally diverse representations of our faith, St. Mary will come closer to realizing our dream of being a parish where, truly, "all are welcome, all belong."

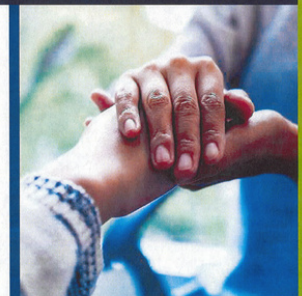

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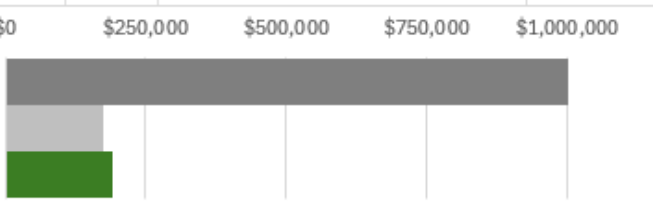
