Shaping our Shared Future

"...like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 2:5

Over the past three weeks, the St. Mary Student Parish Church Enhancement Committee members have shared their thoughts about the proposed plans for our church, from historical, liturgical, intercultural, and accessibility perspectives. As a Committee, we believe that these changes will serve to enhance the sacredness, dignity, and beauty of the interior of the church, while reinforcing the welcoming and inclusive spirit of St. Mary. We hope that these articles have inspired you and have helped you to understand the vision behind the proposed changes to our shared worship space. We now are excited to share with you what these enhancements will actually look like and to gather your input as well through a survey.

We are grateful to have strong support from our parish leadership and from the parish as a whole for the proposed enhancements. The Disciple Maker Index Survey conducted earlier this year indicated that 75% of parishioners recommend renovations to the church. A total of 694 parishioners responded to this survey, more than a third of our registered parishioners. Most agreed or strongly agreed that our church as it stands today has, "nice structure & 'bones,'" but that it is in need of "cosmetic renovation / improvement." The proposed enhancements will be both aesthetic and functional, without making any changes to the fundamental structure of the church. The last major changes to the church were made more than 30 years ago in 1992.

Our parishioners have also been incredibly generous with their financial support. As many of you will recall, these proposed enhancements featured prominently in our capital campaign

materials. As of this summer, we have \$4.3 million in pledges to the campaign from 464 parish families. While we are only two years into the five-year pledge period, we have already received 57% of funds pledged. This means that we have \$1.4 million available for facilities improvements, church enhancements, campus ministry, and resident ministry. We are committed to staying within the campaign budget allocated for the church enhancements and will cover any additional funding needed via other capital funds we thankfully have available.

While our Church Enhancement Committee represents a wide range of our parish community, both residents and students, "old-timers" and recent arrivals, this is your parish, so your voice matters in helping us shape our shared future. In particular, we would like your input about three different conceptual designs for the centered tabernacle and surrounding tabernacle screen. So we invite you to participate in a brief survey that will be open from September 12 to 27. The survey will also allow you to share with us which aspects of the enhancements speak the most to you, and any suggestions to further enhance the beauty of our shared worship space. Thank you for your generous support and prayers as we continue this process!

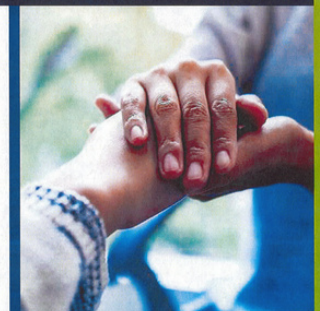

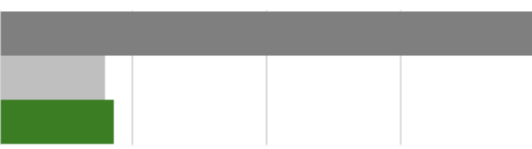
