

For School Leaders / Administrators

Main Message: *Nonpublic Pupil and Transportation Aid ensures educational equity and promotes school choice without diverting funds from public education.*

Talking Points:

- The aid goes to public school districts, not private institutions—it is used to deliver services, not to fund tuition or operations.
- Many of our students are from working- and middle-class families who rely on transportation services or reimbursements to attend the school of their choice.
- The state has long recognized its duty to support the education of all Minnesota children, regardless of the type of school they attend.

For School Teachers

Main Message: *This funding supports the basic educational needs of our students and allows us to serve them equitably.*

Talking Points:

- I see firsthand how vital these services are for student success and well-being, especially health screenings and guidance support.
- Removing this funding would directly impact my ability to teach effectively and serve all students.
- The support doesn't go to our school, it goes to students, and through public school channels.

For Students

Main Message: *This funding helps me get to school and get what I need to learn.*

Talking Points:

- I take the bus every day to get to my school—without this funding, I don't know how I'd get there.
- The books and materials I use in class come from this support.
- Please don't take away something that helps me learn and go to school.

For Parents

Main Message: *As a taxpayer and parent, I rely on this funding to ensure my child receives equitable support in their education.*

Talking Points:

- I chose a nonpublic school for my child because it aligns with our values and provides the right learning environment, but we still depend on public services like transportation and textbooks.
- Eliminating this support would create hardships for our family and many others like us.
- We're not asking for special treatment, just fairness and consistency in supporting students across the board.
