All women have the right to a safe and respectful workplace



You have the right to equal treatment

If you are given fewer opportunities, or less pay, because you are a woman, this is discrimination and is not allowed under Australian law.

You have the right to feel safe and respected Australian law protects you against bullying and harassment. Bullying and harassment can take many forms, including verbal and physical abuse, and it can extend beyond the workplace or occur outside of work hours. If someone is touching you inappropriately or making sexually suggestive comments or jokes, this is illegal.

You have the right to speak up

You have the right to report discrimination or inappropriate behaviour in your workplace. You also have the right to be a member of a union, or be represented by a union official if your workplace is not yet unionised.

How can you get help?
