ICE raids

President Trump has broken up families, instilled fear in our communities, and manufactured a crisis, to what end? The Sustainability Alliance board recognizes the role that US imperialism plays in immigration. We are aware that the enormous economic disparities and political oppression that many people are fleeing when they come to this country are the result of systems that the United States has played a role in creating, and that by exacerbating the climate crisis, President Trump is increasing [climate migration](#), which will get worse over time. It should also be noted that Trump refers to undocumented immigrants as

criminals when, in fact, [it is a civil violation, not a crime, to be undocumented](#), and only a misdemeanor to enter the country illegally the first time.

As an **environmental justice** organization committed to equity and dignity for all, we strongly denounce anti-immigrant bigotry. Immigrants—regardless of documentation status—are vital to the strength, **resilience**, and **sustainability** of Los Angeles. They are caretakers of our communities, stewards of our environment, and leaders in the fight for **climate justice**. There is no meaningful progress on environmental justice without standing shoulder to shoulder with the immigrant communities who power our city and care for its future. We envision a Los Angeles where every person is safe, valued, and protected—no matter where they come from. Let us all do what we can to support each other during this time.
