NIEBNA Board Meeting Minutes

Preliminaries

Meeting was called to order at 5:05pm. Quorum was verified.

The agenda was approved.

The Secretary's report from the November 18, 2021 NIEBNA Board of Directors meeting was approved.

The Treasurer's report was approved.

Reports & Presentations

Ward 3 Report. CM Rainville introduced himself and his staff and:

- Invited board members to a Zoom meeting on January 21 regarding the Hennepin and First NE project and expressed his support for a return to two-way traffic on Hennepin and First in conjunction with the project.
- Expressed his support for getting neighborhood organizations a one-year extension on the deadline for expending unused CPP funds. NIEBNA has over \$90,000 in unused CPP funds that currently must be used by the end of 2022, which is unrealistic.

Overview of NIEBNA Financial Situation. Michael Jon and Lisa provided an overview of financial resources available to NIEBNA:

- \$50 in unspent NRP Phase I funds. Sadly, a Plan Mod is needed to move this little bit of money.
- \$114,359 in unspent NRP Phase II funds. Of this, \$98,000 is in the Affordable Housing Support strategy. These are funds that were loaned out to Propel and have since been repaid with interest.
- Other Phase II funds are sitting various strategies (e.g. small area plan implementation, transportation infrastructure, policing) but are not yet spent or contracted. These are all monies that are in a plan for a specific strategy, but not yet spent.
- Over \$90,000 in unspent CPP/NRP Phase III funds. Currently these funds must be spent by the end of 2022. These funds must be spend on outreach, with a particular emphasis on equitable engagement activities.

Actions

Moved and Seconded: That the Nicollet Island East Bank Neighborhood Association (NIEBNA) Board of Directors supports improvements to East Hennepin Avenue and First Avenue NE that would convert both streets back to two-way traffic, preserve parking, and create bike lanes. Passed.

Discussions

Work Plan for 2022. Michael Jon presented a draft Work Plan for 2022, focused on actionable items that the organization can accomplish in 2022. The action items are grouped into: Organizational Development, Community Engagement, and Community Infrastructure.
