Raising Wages for America's Workers.

Booker has been a leading voice in the fight to raise the minimum wage. He co-sponsored the Minimum Wage Fairness Act, which would raise the minimum wage to \$10.10 per hour. (S. 2223, Vote 117, 4/30/14)

Equal Pay for Equal Work. Booker voted for the Paycheck Fairness Act, which addresses pay disparities between men and women. The bill closes loopholes, empowers women in the workplace and reduces pay inequities for women, who currently earn 77 cents for every dollar earned by men. (S. 2199, Vote 103, 4/9/14)

Supporting Students. Booker voted for the Bank on Students Emergency Loan Refinancing Act, easing the crushing \$1.2 trillion student loan debt owed by graduates and reducing barriers to higher education for working families. The bill allows borrowers to refinance their student loans, putting them one step closer to achieving the American Dream. (S. 2432, Vote 185, 6/11/14)
