Jane Stoever, JD, Ph.D, Clinical Professor of Law, UCI Law; Director, Domestic Violence Clinic; Director, Initiative to End Family Violence

Professor Stoever has extensive experience teaching domestic violence clinics and engaging in scholarship in the areas of domestic violence law, family law, feminist legal theory, and clinical legal theory.



Professor Patricia Leary, Distinguished Teaching Professor of Law, Whittier Law School After receiving a Masters degree in Law from Columbia University, Prof. Leary moved to California and has been teaching at Whittier Law School since 1992. She helped to found On Common Ground, a student organization that annually produces a series of events designed to raise awareness of multiple social and legal issues including race, class, gender, and sexual orientation. Prof. Leary has written papers and served on panels on the topics of abortion, women's rights, women and politics, and the future of feminism, among others.



Hon. Lynne Riddle, Retired Federal Judge, Senior Distinguished Fellow, UCI Law Judge Riddle retired in 2002 and has been actively involved in the community ever since, as a human rights activist. She served as Election Protection Coordinator in Oregon on behalf of the AFL-CIO 2004; serves on the PPOSBC Community Action Fund Board of Directors and serves as a Senior Distinguished Fellow at UCI Law School in the Center for Biotechnology and Global Health Policy.
